He says that after the meeting he missed his wallet containing his grandmother's money. Deputy Sheriff Croner, who was called on the case, learned that a colored man and woman had been seen in an automobile on the street during the evening and he telephoned up and down the line, learning that this couple had reached Cottage Grove. G. B. Pitcher, deputy sheriff, found them at 4 o'clock Friday morning and held them until Irwin got here. As soon as Irwin saw the woman he said she was not the one who had robbed him, and the couple were given their liberty.

The jury in the case of Thomas Funk

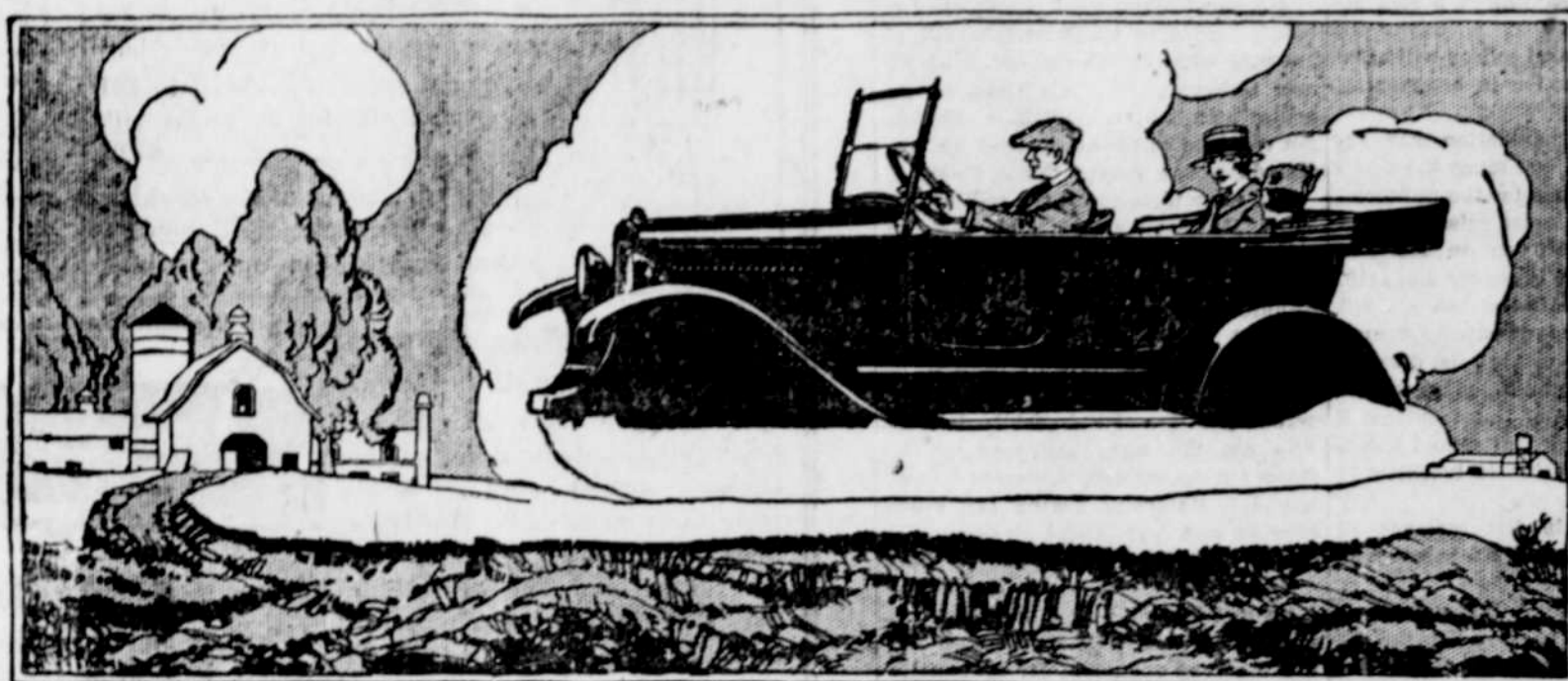

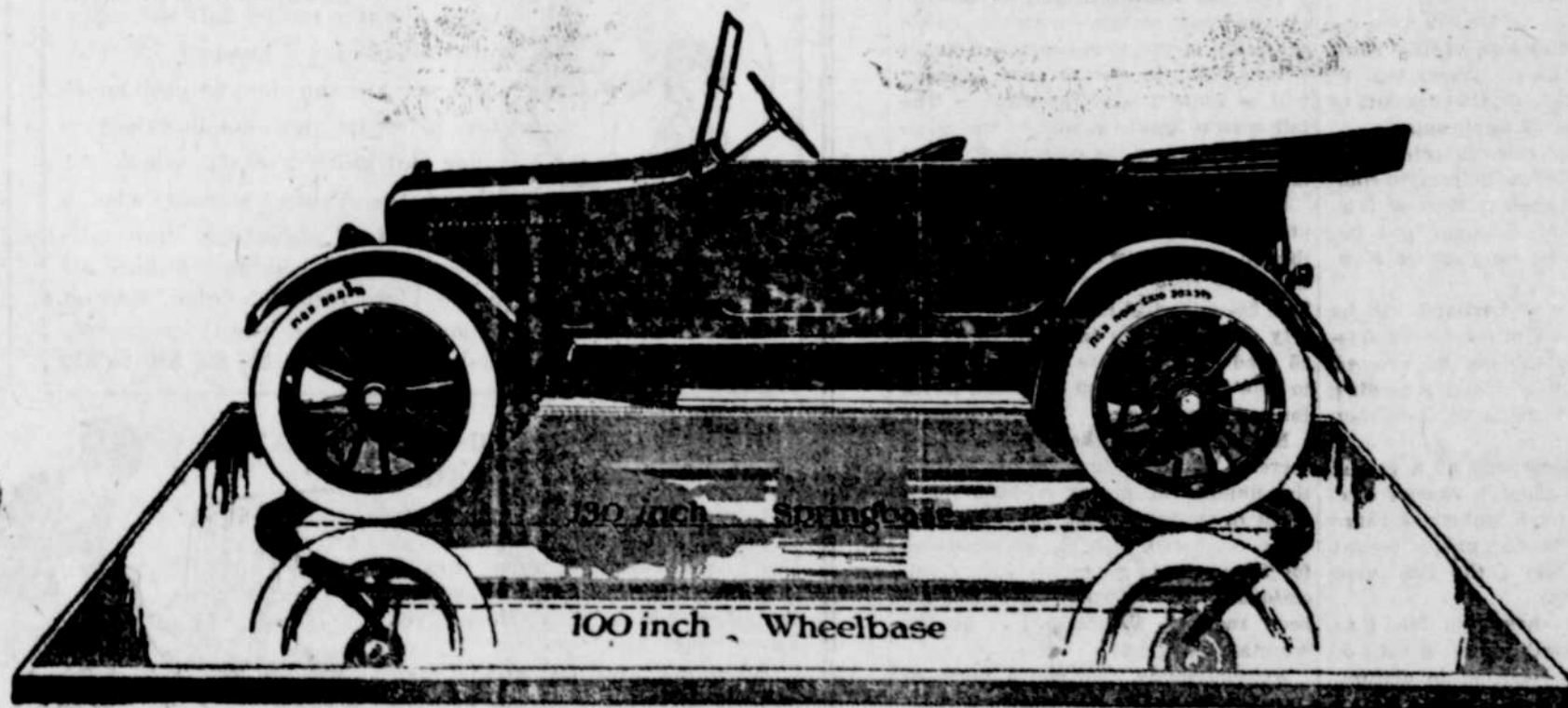
