DELIVERY OF CERTIFICATES AND MEDALS DELAYED

Ruling Necessary as to Some Medals and Information Is Needed as to Certificates.

As was to be expected in a matter covering so many different kinds of service under so many varying conditions, there is some misunderstanding as to the delivery of memorial certificates from the French government to those who died in the service of their country during the recent war and also as to who are entitled to receive Oregon state medals.

A special ruling has been made by the war department in regard to the memorial certificates and these will go to all who died in the service of their country during the war with Germany, whether death occurred at home or abroad. These certificates are, however, to go only to the nearest of kin, and where no nearest of kin was given at the time of induction into the service, the delivery of the certificates can not be made until the name of the nearest of kin is learned. In some cases the name of someone outside of the family was given to be notified in case of death. Through these an effort is being made to trace the nearest of kin and the certificates will be delivered as soon as the required information is at hand.

In the case of the medals the present ruling is that they go only to those who were inducted into the service after or immediately before the declaration of war.

ceding the war and remained in the American Legion post, believes that eventually these medals will be awarded to all who served during the war, as it does not seem fair to discriminate against those who were serving their country during the period preceding the war and remained in the service during the war.

The certificates distributed through American Legion posts did not include men who died in the naval or marine corps service, as these diplomas are being distributed through their respective departments.

Tested Recipes

Molasses Cookies—One cup molasses, one cup brown sugar, three-fourths cup shortening, three-fourths cup warm water, two teaspoons soda, one teaspoon of ginger, one teaspoon cinnamon, one teaspoon vanilla extract, one teaspoon salt, one egg. Mix and knead well; allow to stand over night. Roll out, cut and bake the next day.

Browned Pork Tenderloin—Have the butcher cut one and one-half pounds of pork tenderloin into cutlets. Season and roll in flour. Dip in beaten egg and then roll in fine bread crumbs. Fry until golden brown. Place the meat in the oven to finish cooking. Brown in hot fat.
