

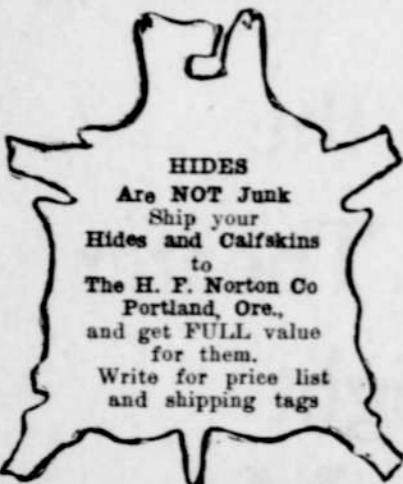

SHOCK ABSORBERS NEEDED IN AUTOMOBILE TIRES

They Take Jolts and Spread Them Over Wide Area in Casing.

The need of shock absorbers in tires is second only to the need for shock absorbers for your nerves when you experience sidewall tire blowouts, and that familiar "gone" feeling, said John Currin, of the Auto Electric and Tire shop, explaining scientific tire construction. The principle of shock absorption is most essential for motors, seats, springs, and in fact every device which generates force or receives its impact from another source. Why should tires be an exception? The long life of some tires is due largely to the discovery and adoption of the principle of maximum shock absorption in tire construction. The widest tread protects the greatest area of fabric or cord that touches or may touch rough roads. Second, the tread that is thickest lasts longest and, therefore, protects the fabric or cords for the longest time from direct road shocks. Third, a series of cushions, such as distinguish standard tires, acts as shock absorbers, reduce to a minimum the vibration of the bending sidewall of the tire, due to underinflation and the direct road shocks.

The shock first strikes the broad tread, then passes to the first, second and third cushions in turn, each time lessening its force and spreading itself over a larger area of the tire. Finally, when a shock or the vibration reaches the inner tube, in the notable words of Theodore Roosevelt, "it hits soft and safe."

Household Hints

When basting velvet, use sewing silk and when the stitches are removed there will be no traces.

To straighten the kinks out of wool that has been used and raveled out, wind the wool in a skein and tie the skein in four places. Dip it in lukewarm water, squeeze the water out gently and hang up to dry. The wool will look like new.

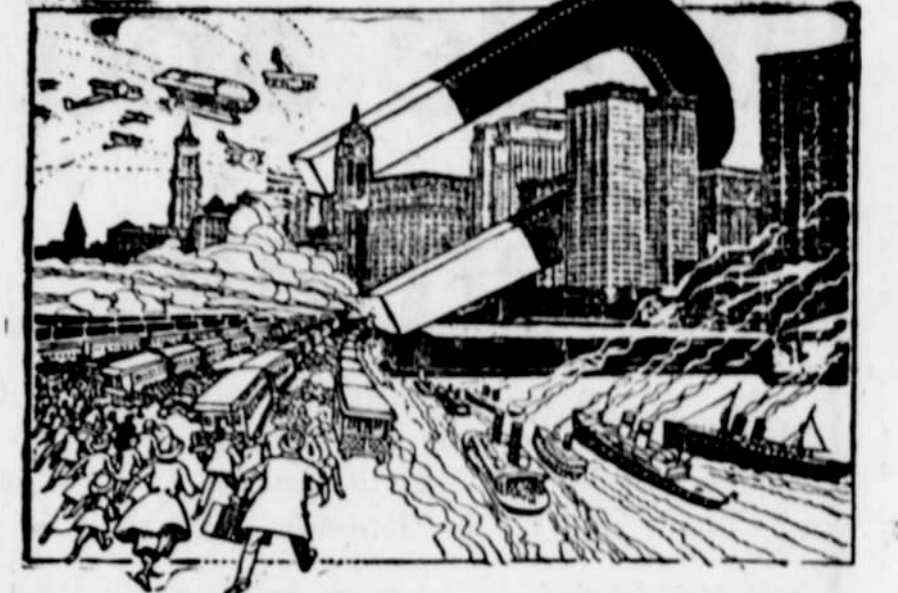

Day and Night Pulpits To Challenge Pleasure



New York is the magnet city of the world. Yearly it attracts 35 million visitors. Times square is the heart of the magnet, and the world's greatest amusement center. Here 45 theaters, and 10 motion picture houses entertain a million people weekly. In this same section are only nineteen churches with a seating capacity of less than ten thousand. And this capacity is never taxed. The Interchurch World Movement has made a survey to determine the causes for this situation and to suggest remedies to change it. It has recommended to the Protestant churches of America that there be established in Times Square a pulpit and platform, where, daily and nightly, eminent ministers, lecturers, and public speakers will talk on religion, art, the sciences and social, moral and educational subjects. It is also suggested that a recreational center be erected with an auditorium for illustrated lectures and motion pictures, and information travel, shopping, legal, and medical aid bureaus.
