Tested Recipes

Dumplings With Peas—To one can of peas add the usual seasoning of salt, pepper, teaspoon sugar, generous lump of butter and a pint of sweet milk. For dumplings take one-half cup of sweet milk, two eggs, a pinch each of salt and pepper. Add flour to make a stiff batter. Drop dough from spoon, cover vessel and cook one-half hour.

Oatmeal Soup—One quart chicken stock, four tablespoons oatmeal, two stalks chopped celery, three slices onion, one carrot (sliced), one tablespoon chopped parsley, two cups hot milk, salt and pepper to taste. Heat the stock to boiling point, add the oatmeal and let boil 10 minutes, then add the

vegetables. Set mixture in double boiler and cook 40 minutes. Strain and just before serving add the hot milk.

Meat and Egg Cakes—Line muffin tins with pie crust, fill half way with left-over meat, ground or chopped finely. Moisten with gravy or water. Bake until crust is done. Just before serving drop an egg on top of each and return to oven until eggs are nicely cooked.

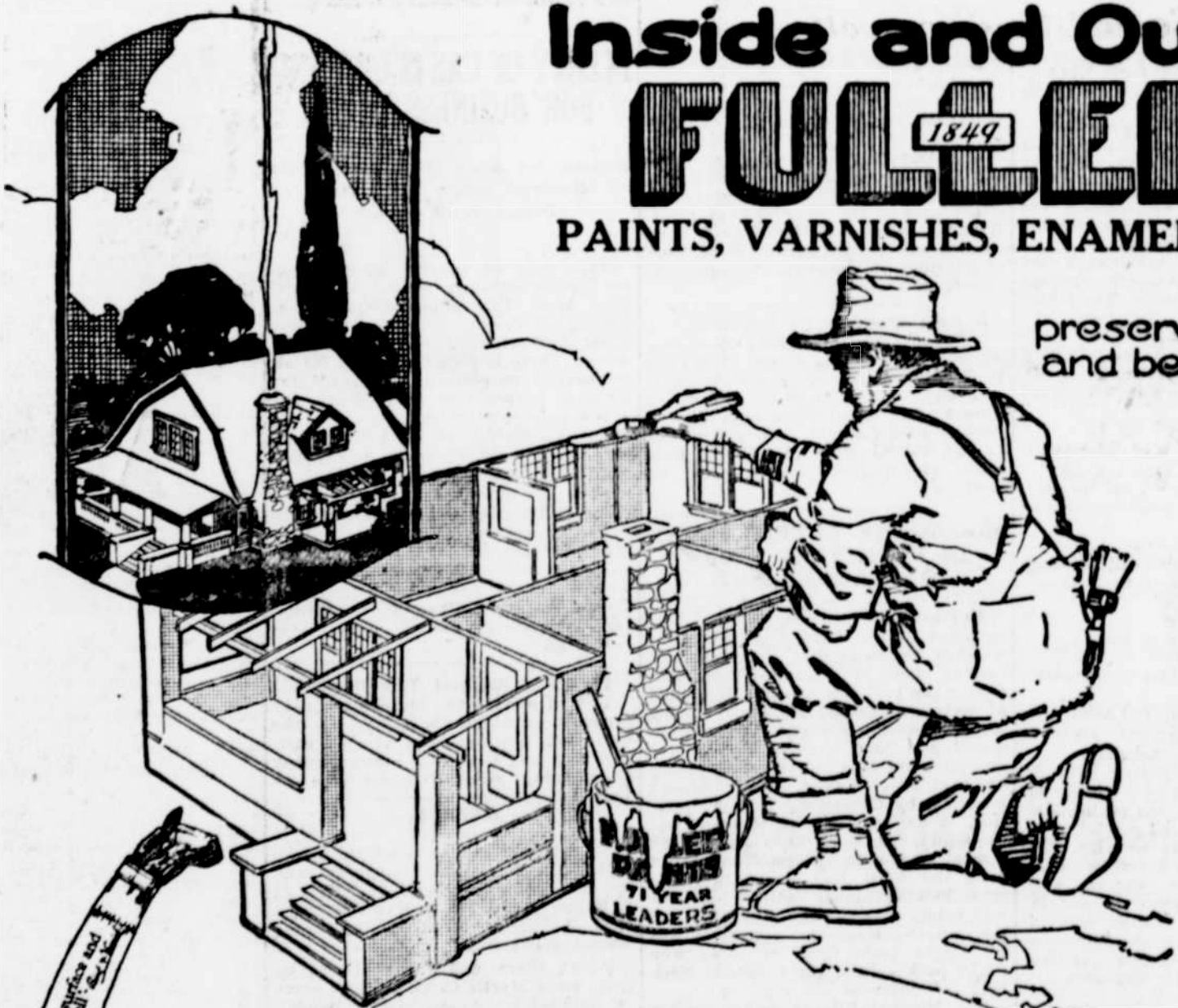
