## LOS ANGELES HAS EARTHQUAKE SHOCK

One Death Results; Property  
Damage Is Estimated at  
**\$100,000.**

Los Angeles, Cal. — Earthquake shocks which started at 6:47 o'clock Monday night and continued intermittently until 5 o'clock Tuesday morning, caused property damage in Los Angeles county estimated at \$100,000, three-fourths of which was in Inglewood, ten miles south of this city.

One death was indirectly due to the most severe of the shocks and several persons were slightly injured by falling debris.

The southern and southwestern sections of Los Angeles city, which are closest to Inglewood, suffered more than the northern residential and central business districts.

The damage in Los Angeles city, estimated at about \$20,000, was due almost entirely to fallen chimneys, broken windows, smashed dishes and bric-a-brac in residences and breakable articles in drug and grocery stores.

The damage in Inglewood was estimated at \$75,000. The buildings which suffered the most damage there were on Commercial street, the main business thoroughfare. In most cases the fronts of the buildings fell into the street, leaving the three other walls standing.

Lemon Rice Pudding—One cup rice, two quarts boiling water, one tablespoon salt, one pint milk, half cup of sugar, two tablespoons butter and the grated rind and juice of one-half lemon. Pick over and wash the rice and cook in the boiling salted water until soft. Drain and add milk, sugar, butter and rind and juice of the one-half lemon. Put in a buttered baking dish and bake until firm. Cover with meringue, using whites of two eggs, one-half cup powdered sugar and one teaspoon lemon juice.
