Sugared Walnuts—The quickest and easiest as well as the most delightful confection is made with a cup of sugar and four teaspoonfuls of water; boil it until it spins a thread, then add about two cups walnuts and stir until the sugar hardens on the walnuts. A little salt improves the flavor.

One-quarter pound of copperas dissolved in two quarts of boiling water is the best thing for cleaning out a clogged sink or drain.

A little oatmeal in water on the back of the stove for washing the hands when kitchen work is done will keep the hands white and smooth.

If bluing is mixed with hot water before adding to rinse water the clothes will not be streaked even if the water is hard.
