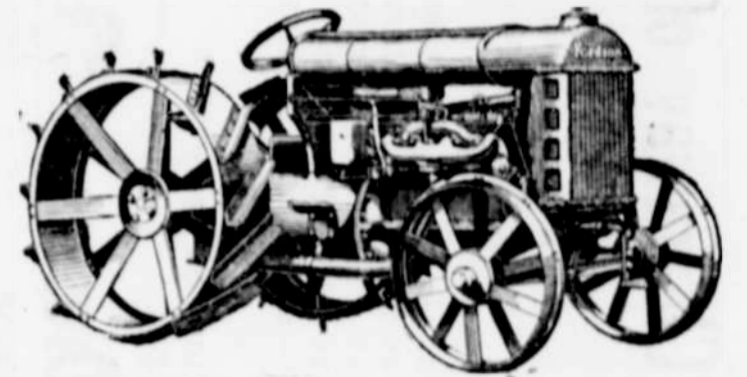
Buicks Going Up
