OREGON NEWS NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

Principal Events of the Week Briefly Sketched for Information of Our Readers.

Oregon stands eighth in the list in regard to paid-up membership in the American Legion.

Dr. O. D. Duane's 20-acre cherry orchard near The Dalles this year netted him a profit of \$10,969.

More than 2000 retail buyers are expected in Portland during annual buyers' week, August 9 to 14.

Sheriff Johnson of Hood River county has asked for volunteers to assist him in enforcing speed laws.

Indications are that the commercial apple crop of the state as a whole will be about 50 per cent of last year.

Oregon wheat exported during the year ended June 30, 1920, amounted to 2,875,882 bushels and flour 3,291,115 barrels.

Because it is no longer a necessary organization in the state, Governor Olcott has dissolved the state council of defense.

William Porter, 59, instructor in foraging at the Oregon Agricultural college, died Thursday at his home in Corvallis.

The Lane county court has decided not to build a new bridge across the Willamette at Harrisburg for at least two years.

An underground crossing will be built where the Pacific highway crosses the railroad two miles north of Albany.

The Portland Railway, Light and Power company has paid to Clackamas county \$94,000, the first half of its county taxes.

The recently organized Southwestern Oregon Livestock association is planning to hold an annual exposition at Marshfield.

Members of the Oregon State Dental association opened the first session of their 27th annual convention Monday morning in Portland.

Lightning struck and seriously damaged the steeple of the First Presbyterian church in Portland during a heavy electric storm.

Approximately 125,000 applications for motor vehicle drivers' licenses have been received at the offices of the secretary of state.

At the present rate of growth of bank clearings in Portland it is estimated that this year's total will reach the \$2,000,000,000 mark.

Three hundred dollars was appropriated by the city council of Albany to assist in the establishment of a municipal swimming pool.

Harry Shown of Twickenham in Wheeler county was seriously burned while trying to start a crude oil burning engine used in irrigation.

Reverend W. M. Case of Eugene has been elected moderator of the Oregon synod of the Presbyterian church to succeed L. M. Boozer of Medford.

One hundred aliens were deported from Oregon in the fiscal year ending June 30, according to the annual report of the bureau of immigration.

Hereafter marriage will not be a bar to election to position as teacher in the Portland public schools, according to policy established by the school board.

The state board of control now has in transit to the Robert Andrews company of New York a carload of flax fiber and tow for which the state receives \$11,621.50.

The boys' and girls' industrial clubs of Shedd, among which is included the largest boys' Jersey calf club in the world, will hold their annual industrial fair on September 10.

On the ground that the city of Woodburn has exceeded its limit of indebtedness, A. C. Simmons has brought suit to restrain the city from undertaking certain improvements.

The city of Roseburg has received legal advice that bonds recently authorized by a special election for the sum of \$7000 for an aviation field outside the city limits are invalid.

Salem Cherrians have accepted the proposal of A. H. Lea, secretary of the state fair board, that the Cherrians make Tuesday, September 28, of state fair week, a special booster day.

Exports from the Portland district during the year ended June 30, 1920, were valued at \$40,388,320, while the exports from the Astoria district for the same period were valued at approximately \$7,000,000.

With the harvest of one of the largest cherry crops in the history of the state in full blast, the fruit, rain-split, is a drug on the market and hard to move at any price, according to reports coming from Willamette valley points.

Representing practically every line of business in Portland, a petition bearing the names of more than 300 men and women urging Mayor George L. Baker to announce himself a candidate for re-election, was presented to the mayor.

Fire protection at Roseburg and Medford is declared inadequate by G. W. Stokes, an investigator for the state fire marshal's department. In Roseburg Stokes found only 63 hydrants. There should be twice that number, he says.

What is said to be the largest still yet captured in Oregon was raffled near Newberg by federal revenue officers who seized 150 gallons of corn moonshine whisky and 800 gallons of corn mash. The still was said to have a capacity of 100 gallons a day.

Phillip Ott, 45, a farmer of Hubbard, was killed almost instantly when his light touring car crashed through the railing of the bridge over Pudding river, just outside of the city limits of Aurora, on the Pacific highway, and fell a distance of about 40 feet.

Because of the tendency of members of the dental profession to come from the eastern states to the west, while few go from the west to the east, the state board of dental examiners has placed its disapproval on a proposed reciprocal exchange of dental licenses.

Officials of the socialist party have filed in the office of Sam A. Koser, secretary of state, certificates of nomination of candidates for presidential electors, secretary of state, dairy and food commissioner and commissioner of the public service commission for the western Oregon district.

Not less than \$558,000 will be netted this season to loganberry growers within a radius of ten miles of Salem, according to an estimate of J. L. Van Doren, berry buyer of Salem.

The crop disposed of at a figure sufficiently high to bring this amount is estimated at 6,500,000 pounds.

While cutting hay on his farm a few days ago Fred Lockwood, a rancher of the North Fork country in the western end of Lane county, cut off both feet of his 3-year-old daughter, who was playing in the tall oats. The little girl was not seen by her father until an instant before the sickle hit her.

Following the breaking of a dike at Brownsmead in the eastern part of Clatsop county, approximately 300 acres of fine farm land were inundated and damage estimated between \$7000 and \$8000 has resulted. About 300 feet of the dike collapsed as a result of the sand foundation giving away.

Wasco county's population, according to census figures, is 13,648 men, women and children. An apparent decrease of 2788 since the 1910 census, totaling 16,336 persons, is explained by the county being redistricted and nearly one-third of the residents transferred to another county since 1910.

The KITCHEN CABINET

GOOD THINGS FOR THE FAMILY.

An easy pastry and one which may be kept for several days in the ice chest is prepared as follows: Take one cupful of lard and one-half cupful (scant) of boiling water, add one teaspoonful of salt and stir until the lard is dissolved, then add three cupfuls of sifted flour, mix well and set away to become cool. This makes the crust for three covered pies and the pastry is delicate and tender.

Cherry Sponge.—Take two cupfuls of canned cherries, two eggs, three-fourths of a cupful of sugar, one-fourth of a cupful of hot water, three-fourths of a cupful of flour, one teaspoonful of lemon juice, two teaspoonfuls of baking powder and one-fourth of a teaspoonful of salt. Beat the yolks of the eggs until thick and lemon colored. Add half the sugar gradually and beat until smooth. Add the flour mixed and sifted with the baking powder and salt. Add the whites of the eggs beaten stiff and dry. In the bottom of a buttered baking dish put the cherries. Pour the batter over and bake in a moderate oven forty minutes. If the cherries are tart sprinkle them with sugar before covering them with the batter. The sauce from the fruit will be all that is necessary to serve with the pudding.

Scalloped Noodles.—This is a dish which offers a variety of combinations. Prepare the noodles—those made at home are much better than the carton variety. Take veal and chicken broth with gravy and small pieces of the meat, make layer of the noodles, meat and gravy and finish the top with crumbs. Bake in a hot oven long enough to cook the noodles. Serve hot as a luncheon dish. This is called warmen in Chinese restaurants.

Apple Corn Bread.—Mix together four cupfuls of cornmeal, two teaspoonfuls of baking powder, half a teaspoonful of salt, then add two cupfuls of chopped apples, one-fourth of a cupful of shortening, and one and one-fourth cupfuls of water. Bake forty minutes in a slow oven.
