Tested Recipes

Sweet Milk Pancakes.

One and one-half cups milk (scant), one and one-half cups flour, one egg, one teaspoon butter, (melted), half teaspoon salt, two teaspoons baking powder.

Sift flour, salt and baking powder together, beat egg and add milk. This makes griddle cakes for my family of three.

Good Dumplings.

In making a stew like lamb, beef, chicken, etc., dumplings are the hard part. This is the way I make mine:

One pint pastry flour, one teaspoon cream tartar, one-half teaspoon soda, pinch salt. Stir in enough water to make light batter. Then while stew is cooking rapidly, drop into stew kettle by spoonfuls. Cover lightly and let alone for the 10 minutes. You will find them as round and light as can be.

Corn Bread.

One cup meal, one-third cup flour, one cup cold water, one egg, beaten in the meal; salt, two teaspoons baking powder, two tablespoons sugar, two tablespoons butter.

Clam Fritters.

One pint clams, 2 eggs, 1/2 cup milk, 1 1/3 cups flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, salt and pepper.

Clean clams, drain from their liquid and chop. Beat eggs until light; add milk and flour mixed and sifted with baking powder, then add chopped clams and season highly with salt and pepper. Drop big spoonfuls and fry in deep fat. Drain on brown paper.

These are very fine.

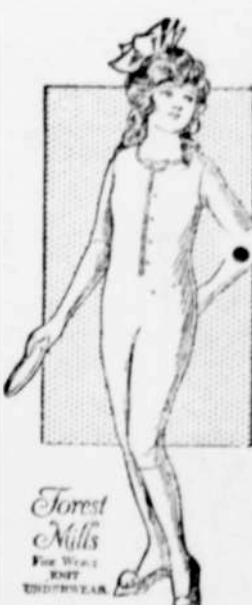
