Obituary.

D. R. There were born to this union four daughters, Mrs. O. P. Wills, Mrs. W. C. Shortridge, Mrs. J. T. Small and Mrs. W. T. Jones, of Cottage Grove. His wife preceded him March 11, 1914. Besides the four daughters he leaves two brothers and one sister, Dr. T. W. Harris, of Eugene; J. H. Harris, of Bellingham, Wash., and Mrs. Martha Baughman, of Cottage Grove. Ten grandchildren, three great-grandchildren, many nieces and nephews and a host of friends mourn his loss. He became a Christian while yet a young man and remained faithful until death. Interment was in the Taylor-Lane cemetery, Rev. D. C. Kellogg, of Eugene, officiating.
