LANE CAPTURES HONORS AS BEST CORN COUNTY

The showing made by Lane county at the first annual Oregon state corn show held in Portland was the best from counties in the non-irrigated district and the western Oregon section.

In the class A exhibits from the non-irrigated section Lane county had three in lot 1, or 10-ear exhibit, and won first and third prizes, E. E. Ross, of motor route A, Eugene, being awarded first prize and Harold Hurd, of Coburg, third. In lot two, or 100-ear exhibits, there were two entries from Lane county, Clinton Hurd, of Coburg, winning first and Mr. Ross third.

Lane county was the only county in the western part of the state to win prizes in these two lots.

As a result of this showing there is already a demand for seed corn from the prize winners and orders have begun to come in from different parts of the state.

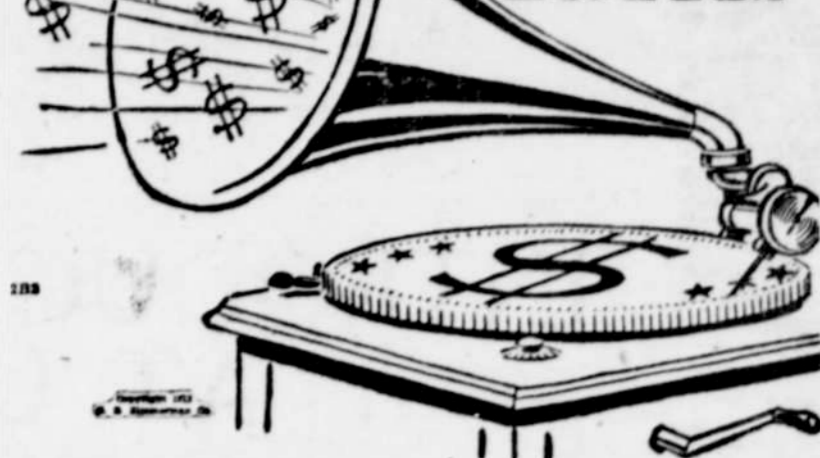
## An Aristocratic Southerner.

Those who intend to see, or have seen, David Belasco's production of Willard Mack's romance, "Tiger Rose," which comes to the Eugene theater at Eugene next Monday night, Dec. 13, will no doubt be, or have been, impressed with the character of "Dr. Dan Susick" as portrayed by Jack J. Bertin, and will have wondered from whom or where he gleaned his remarkable conception of that important role. In the first place, Jack, as he is called (although his real name is Jacques), is a southerner of the most pronounced type, an aristocrat by birth and lineage extending away back to the early Spanish settlers upon the bayous and lakes and streams around about southern Louisiana, and secondly from the mixture of this pure Castilian with the Arcadians—those emigrants from Canada who in 1745 after the defeat of the French at Louisiana, sought homes in the southern climes; intermarried with the older settlers, the Spanish, and founded what has been known as the most exclusive aristocratic race upon earth—the Creole—as exemplified in the present day by the merchant princes; by the men of affairs; by the savants of the southland.

Jack Bertin comes to his lineage, too, from a long line of physician ancestors. His father and his forebears, away back to his great grandfathers, having been esculapians and students as well as practitioners of the art of healing. On the paternal side Bertin can trace his descent from the early French governor-generals of Canada, and on the maternal side to the first rulers of New Spain. His own daddy practiced up and down the various settlements of the Mississippi river, over in the Bayou Teche country and down New Iberia way, even over into the regions of Bayou Cook where the famous New Orleans oysters come from, ere he felt himself competent to settle in the Crescent City and become one of its most renowned medical men.

In his daddy's peregrinations young Jack accompanied his pere, from him imbued that roving spirit that led the young student from Tulane university to discard the arts and the sciences of his forebears and take upon himself the actor's life. d10
