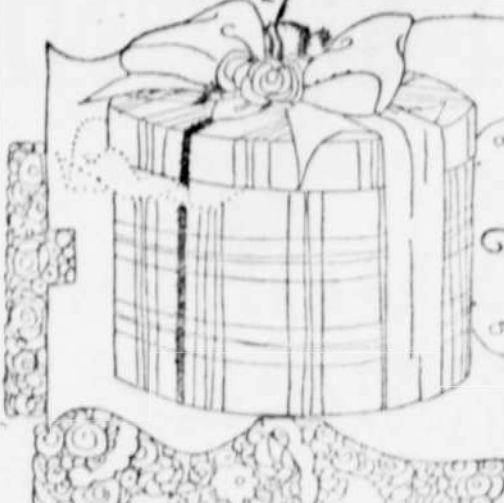

Sheep growers are interested in a demonstration on the care of sheep which will be given next Friday by Prof. O. M. Nelson, sheep specialist from O. A. C., to be held at the D. G. McFarland place, corner of Pacific highway and Birch avenue.

There is a proper time to shear and a proper method of doing the shearing, also a way in which the fleece should be tied and handled to put it in good market condition.

Docking and sterilization insure from \$1 to \$2 more for the lambs when they are sent to market.

Those points will be demonstrated by Prof. Nelson.
