The records of the county show that during 1920 the sum of \$11,000 was paid out in widows' pensions, and \$12,381.91 for paupers, including the upkeep of the poor farm. Judge Barnard said that he expects this amount to increase as the population of the city and county grows and a marked increase will be noted if the times become harder than they are now.
