#### City Council

June 13.—Council met in adjourned session, roll call, present: Councilmen Allison, Durham, Kime, Mackin, Short, Ventch, the mayor, city attorney, recorder, marshal.

By invitation, C. M. Shinn, manager of the Cottage Grove Electric company, explained to the council the necessity for the proposed increase in rates to private consumers, stating that the shut down of the saw mill that furnished fuel for the electric plant was the cause as it had more than doubled the fuel cost; that he had investigated price of coal and oil but either was more than cord wood, which was costing at the rate of \$1000 a month. The cost of the mill wood had been \$496 a month. He said the rates would be in effect only during the mill shut down.

Ralph D. Mores, bond buyer of Portland, proposed to council to have bond attorney direct the steps taken for the issuance of \$15,000 bond refunding the issue of October 1, 1901, furnish the blank bonds, etc., at a cost of \$200, which sum was to be remitted if the bonds were awarded to the house he represented.

On motion the matter of entering a contract for legal advice and printing of bonds was postponed until a later date.

On motion the city attorney was directed to file objections with the Public Service commission to the proposed new light rate and ask for a hearing, and for a review of the decision re the valuation of the electric light plant.

Street committee grants more time to report on alley obstructions.

On motion the water commissioner, by and with the advice and assent of the water committee, was authorized to secure the agreement for repair from Blake-Compton Co.

Ordinance No. 470, levying an assessment for the improvement of the alley in blocks 4 and 5, J. H. McFarland's addition, was, on motion, under suspension of the rules, read a first and second time by title only. On motion, all councilmen present consenting and there being no objections, Ordinance No. 470 was read a third time and placed on final passage. Roll was called, those voting yes were Allison, Durham, Kime, Short and Ventch—6; voting no, none. Ordinance No. 470 was declared adopted and was signed by the mayor.

Ordinance No. 471, adopting report of city engineer on the proposed condemnation of a portion of the lot of Frank Pleuard for the extension and widening of south Lane street, was, on motion, under suspension of the rules, read first and second time by title only. On motion all councilmen present consenting and there being no objections, Ordinance No. 471 was read a third time and placed on final passage. Roll was called, those voting yes were Allison, Durham, Kime, Mackin, Short and Ventch—6; voting no, none. Ordinance No. 471 was declared adopted and was signed by the mayor.
