## SERVICE MEN IN COUNTY RECEIVE \$5000 A MONTH

Each month there is added to the wealth of Lane county the sum of \$5016.25 for which no man labors, no man turns a hand. It comes in payment for trials already undergone.

It is the United States government's compensation to the men who were wounded overseas during the great war or who suffered in other ways to bring about their total or partial disability or in any way handicapped them in their struggle for existence.

In the past two years Lane county has contributed in annual roll call \$9164. In the past two years, or since the end of the war, the chapter has brought into the county \$59,868.44, or six times the amount given to its support. In April alone special claims settled amounted to \$3896.89.

The names of 278 veterans appear on the lists as having made application for compensation. Of this number about one-third received the \$5,016.25 mentioned as the amount brought into the county each month.

The Red cross chapter plays the role of service agency in the compensation work. It acts as a bumper between the federal departments and the service men.
