LOCAL CHAMPS TWICE TAKE EUGENE INTO CAMP

County Seaters Have Strong Team but Are Outclassed by Heavy Hitters From Here.

Cottage Grove maintained its heavy batting record Sunday by defeating Eugene 16 to 7. The teams were more evenly matched than the score indicated, Eugene having Shy Huntington at the receiving end and all positions filled with semi-professionals. Cellers, who did the twirling for the locals, was also heavy with the stick and batted in five runs. Brumbaugh led some fancy work in left field, accepting every possible chance. Huntington, for Eugene, played a real game, but his team went to pieces at critical moments. Not half the runs were earned, the visitors getting their first three on one hit.

Cottage Grove started some rapid work in mathematics when Eugene began booting the ball around in the third.

"General" King voluntarily fined himself "five" when he neglected to score by neglecting to take advantage of a situation which assured him an extra base. However he made up for the slight error when he scored from second on what was hardly a single base hit.

Hill maintained his popularity with his work at first.

Eugene tied the score in the fourth when the locals got to playing ping pong with the sphere but the locals again took the lead in the fifth and never again did the visitors have a chance.

With things coming so easy, Pendleton relieved Cellers in the box. While not as popular as the old Roman Carl, he performed with credit to himself.

In the fifth Cottage Grove filled the plates and kept them full, with two forced out and one forced in until cellers slammed out a two-bagger that netted three tallies.
