COUNTY IS UNABLE TO GET OVER WILLAMETTE

Selection of Either Proposed Route Does Not Make Possible Its Financing.

Lane county cannot at this time either afford to build the Willamette bridge at Harrisburg or to pay for its share of the paving of highway from Harrisburg to Eugene by way of Coburg, according to M. H. Harlow, county commissioner.

If the highway is definitely located through Harrisburg and the bridge is built there, Lane county would be compelled to build five smaller bridges between Lancaster and the big bridge in order that traffic might be kept out of the water. The road extends

along a very low bottom and over a number of sloughs. This would be exceedingly expensive for Lane county. On the other hand, it is pointed out by the commissioner, Lane county's expense in preparing the road bed by way of the Coburg route for the pavement and the construction of a new bridge across the McKenzie river would amount to a great deal more than the county could afford at the present time, although the expense would be less than to build these other bridges.

Emmett Sharp, Lane county's other commissioner, who has just returned from Portland, where he conferred with members of the state highway commission and attended a meeting of that body, says that the commission does not look with much favor upon the Harrisburg-Coburg-McKenzie route. It will require only about four miles of pavement south of Harrisburg by the original route, whereas it would require about 14 miles of additional

pavement by the other route. Mr. Sharp figures that it would cost about \$400,000 to pave this stretch. To build a bridge at Harrisburg and lay pavement from the bridge to Junction City would cost about half this sum, Mr. Sharp estimates, although he admits that Lane county would be called upon to pay a large part of the cost of the bridge.

Commissioner Sharp says that the state commission stated they would not definitely decide upon the North fork road in the western part of Lane county as a link in the Eugene-Portland highway until the Southern Pacific company has finished its road down the north bank of the Siuslaw between Mapleton and Cushman. After that, Mr. Sharp thinks the commission will adopt this road as a part of the highway. He says the state will save \$100,000 to \$150,000 by selecting this route.
