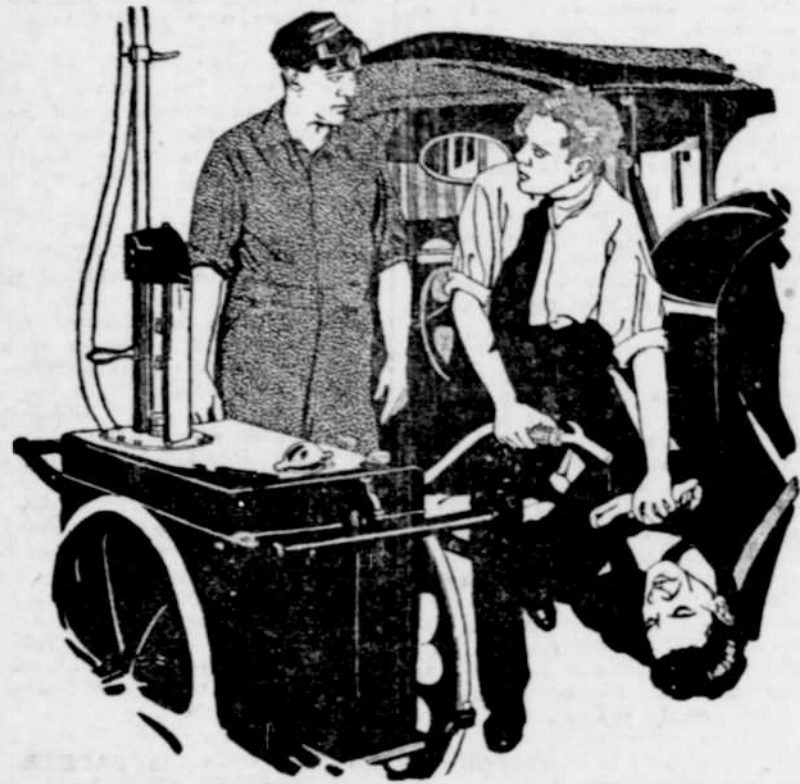

City Council

Nov. 21.—Council met in adjourned session. Present: Mayor, Councilmen Allison, Durham, Mackin, Short and Ventch.

Mr. Coffman asked that something be done in regard to the drainage of the district south of the Standard Oil company's plant. Street superintendent directed to have the ditches thereabouts cleaned.

On motion the scattering cedar trees below the reservoir on the Silk creek water shed reserve, about 10,400 board feet, were sold to W. A. Hemenway at \$2.50 per thousand.

City attorney directed to collect from owner of building cost of repair of drain pipe in rear of Hotel Oregon.

City Transfer announced reduction of street sweeping charge from \$1 to 75c an hour, beginning December 1.

Refund of \$1 for violation of motor vehicle ordinance ordered made. Parties exceeded speed limit but were outside city limits when overtaken by officer.

Bids of Guy F. Pyle for paving of Ninth street from city limits south to Grover avenue and south Sixth and south Lane streets to south city limits were on motion accepted.

Ordinance for sale of bonds under Bancroft law was adopted. These bonds represent the amount that property owners were assessed for improvement of streets, alleys and sewers this summer and who asked to have their payments extended over 10 years.

On motion council decided to ask for Dinner creek watershed as a reserve for city water supply.

Amount of H. H. Fiester's bond as water rent collector was fixed at \$1000 and water committee directed to outline his duties.

The tree trimming ordinance was ordered enforced.
