Fish Box

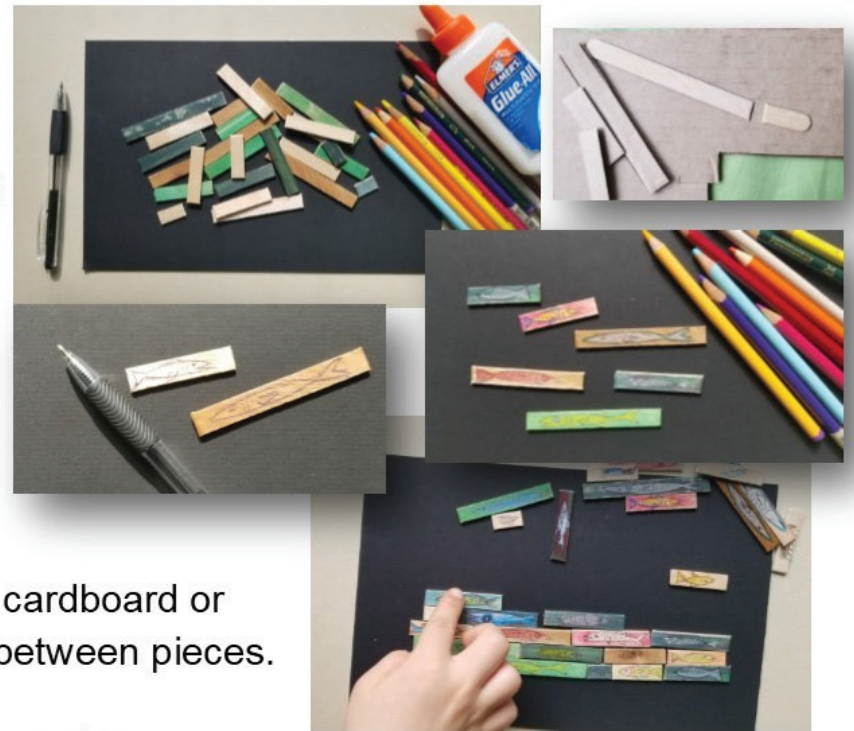
Ben grew up in Lincoln City, graduated from Taft High, studied art, traveled, fished and is now a successful working artist. He is well known for his "fish boxes".

Creative Quarantine:

DIY art relief from the Lincoln City Cultural Center

You will need: popsicle sticks or cardboard strips, food color or watercolor paint, markers or colored pencils, black pen, glue and a 6 x 8" piece of black matt board or cardboard to make this **Soeby-style Fish Box**.

1. Cut the ends off the popsicle sticks (or cardboard strips) and cut them into different lengths. Color them with either food color or watercolor paint and let them dry.
2. Use black pen to draw fish shapes on each piece and color with marker or colored pencil. Try using light-colored pencil on the dark pieces and white outlines.
3. Then put them together like a puzzle on a piece of black cardboard or matt board and glue them down. Try not to leave any gaps between pieces.



4. While it's drying, put a heavy book on top of it to keep the pieces flat. Enjoy.
