

# Creative Quarantine:

DIY art relief from the Lincoln City Cultural Center

## Fabric Bowl Making Project



**You will need:** Fabric scraps and strips, Mod Podge glue, scissors, 1" brush, bowl, plastic wrap, something to hold your bowl off the work surface (like a jar), container to hold glue mix and a rag.



1. First cover your work surface. Then cover a bowl well with plastic wrap. Prop up your upside-down covered bowl (the mold) with something like a jar. Mix the Mod Podge with 1/3 part water and stir well.
2. Next, brush the glue onto the plastic covered bowl and stick on strips of fabric (if there is a pattern, glue it pattern side down). Cover the bowl completely with fabric strips. This fabric will be the inside of your fabric bowl.
3. When gluing the fabric, make sure that all edges are stuck down well and that there is a layer of glue under and also over the top of the fabric. Once you finish the inside layer, add another layer of fabric pieces with the pattern sides up to make the outside layer of your fabric bowl.
4. Let it dry for 12 hours and remove. Peel the plastic wrap off and let it dry a bit longer. Finally, trim the edges any way you like.



**Fun Challenge:** Try covering carton bottoms too. Just glue fabric pieces onto the sides and trim the edge. Have fun.
