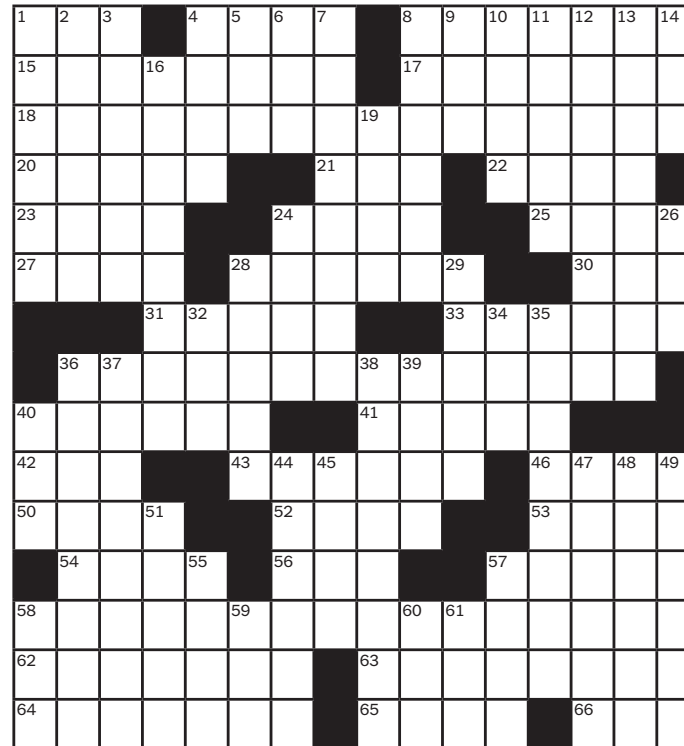

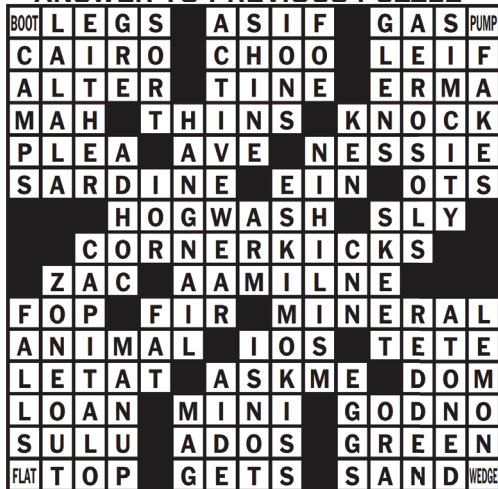

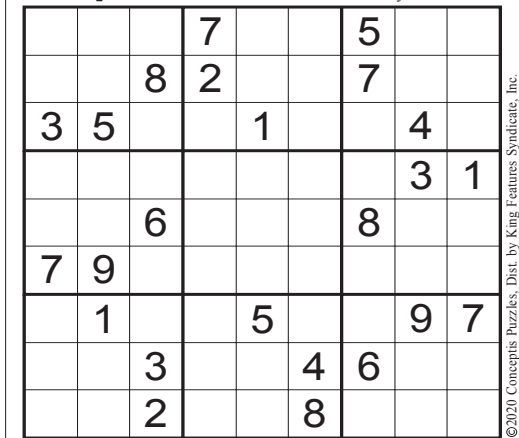

Take this Super Quiz to a Ph.D. Score 1 point for each correct answer on the Freshman Level, 2 points on the Graduate Level and 3 points on the Ph.D. Level.

**Subject: RACKET SPORTS**

Identify the racket sport. (e.g., This sport is derived from tennis and is often called "paddle."  
 Answer: Platform tennis.)

**FRESHMAN LEVEL**
