## Flower Field Landscape Painting

You will need: Stock card paper or watercolor paper, a light-colored crayon (light yellow or light green works well), table salt, watercolor paint (or any other paint watered down will work), water container, brush and rag.

- 1. Pressing very firmly with the crayon, draw thick horizon line across your paper. Under the line, draw lots of up-and-down hatch marks in three or more lines all the way across the page. The hatch marks should get bigger as you get closer to the bottom. On top of the horizon line, scribble a line of trees across the page and add some trunks.
- 2. Next, start painting each color in stripes all the way across your page. Decide what color you want your flower field to be and fill it in. The crayon drawing should resist the paint and show right through. When you are done painting and before the paint is dry, sprinkle some salt over it for a speckled look as it dries.
- 3. When your painting is totally dry, brush off the excess salt and you can add another layer of paint or colored pencil for richer colors if you want. Enjoy.
