Other finishers for Coach Mark Cotton's team were Kevin Monson, twenty-eighth; Kirk Breese, thirty-second; Charles Kinsey, sixty-seventh; Bruce Bromley, seventieth; Ardy Ison, ninety-fourth, and Bill Francis, one hundred-twentieth.

Individual winner Jan Mc-Neale of Thurston, in winning the title, broke the old record of 12:31.6 over the 2.5-mile course set by General Ron Byers in

McNeale was timed in 12:28.8 as he barely overcame Benson's sophomore Mike Hahn, who also eclipsed the old record in finishing about a yard behind the Thurston ace. Coach Cotton remarked that it was "one of the most thrilling finishes I've ever
