

Boys, girls to swim in state contest

After successfully competing in the city meet, the girls' and boys' swimming teams will travel to Eugene tomorrow for the state contest.

"A real good effort, with no disappointments" were the words Coach Carl Rubin used to sum up his team's third place showing in the city swim meet.

Six swimmers will represent the Generals at the state meet tomorrow. They are Jeff Pitman, Bob Mills, Bruce Rector, Bob Foster and alternate Bob Messerschmidt in the 200 yard medley race, Foster and Rector in the 50 yard freestyle, and Bruce Parker in the diving event.

Preliminaries are slated to begin at 10 a.m. with the finals occurring at 7 p.m. that night.

Wilson high school, scoring 104½ points, broke one relay and three individual records on their way to capturing the city title.

Records fell to the strong Wilson team in the 200 yard medley relay, 100 yard breast stroke, 200 yard freestyle and the 100 yard freestyle.

Besides breaking records, the Trojans also completely dominated the action as they took first in 8 out of 10 events. Benson placed second with 40½ points while the Generals were close behind with 35 points.

Garnering points for the Generals were Foster and Rector, second and third in the 50 yard freestyle; Mark Powell, fourth in the 100 yard butterfly; Mills and Mike Phillips, fourth and fifth in the 100 yard breast stroke; Jeff Pitman, fifth in the 100 yard backstroke, and a second place finish by the medley relay team.

Freshman Parker added 8 points to the team's total as he tied for first place with Mike Nelson of Franklin in the diving event. Parker and Nelson were the only 2 boys entered in the event and both will go to the state meet.

After taking second place in the city meet, the girls' varsity swim team is preparing to go to the state meet.

"Wilson took first place, and Lincoln third," said Mrs. Rosellan Sweet, girls' swimming coach, concerning the city meet. "We expect to take third in state."

"We had to place at least third in the city meet in order to go on

to the state meet," she commented.

First places were taken by a medley relay team including Carol Thoma, Roberta Taylor, Sue Gottsch and Manon Whitcher. Carol also took first in the 100 yard backstroke with a time of 1:10.1. Patty Jensen took first in the 200 yard freestyle and the 100 yard butterfly.

In the free relay race, a team including Manon, Judy Shaw, Michelle Pape and Chris Cole also took a first place.

Freshman Ann Sidell took second place in the 100 yard freestyle, breaking the standing city record with a time of 59.9 seconds.

Fourth places were taken by Michelle in the 50 yard freestyle, and Roberta in the 50 yard butterfly.

Freshman Jan Sexton took fifth place in the 100 yard individual medley.

"I was very pleased with the over-all performances of the girls," said Mrs. Sweet, "but I wasn't surprised at taking second place."

Coaches select 'All-City' team; Onia Bates given most votes

City league coaches selected 6 Generals for the Oregonian "All-City" football team and the Oregon Journal poll was nearly the same. Onia Bates captured the most votes and made both first string offense and defense.

Joining Bates on the offensive crew are center Cliff Rose and back Bob ESwen. Voted to first team defense were end George Robinson, linebacker Steve Shaw, guard Don Sorber, and Bates at halfback.

Dave Reichle gained second team honors at defensive guard and made honorable mention offense, and Pete Slenning gained honorable mention at defensive end. Ewen was honorable mention defensive halfback, and Rose was honorable mention defensive tackle.

In the Oregon Journal poll, Ewen, Bates and Rose were again first team selections.

Sorber and Reichle were second string, and back John Devaney, Shaw, and Robinson were honorable mention choices.

In scoring 17 touchdowns for 102 points, Bates led the league in rushing with 1105 yards in 88 carries. He also shared 8 passes for 205 yards and returned 16

punts for 279 yards.

Ewen scored 8 touchdowns and 5 conversions for 53 points, carried 129 times for 894 yards, and completed 20 of 75 passes for 391 yards and 4 touchdowns.

Onia Bates and Cliff Rose were selected to first team "All-State" in the Oregon Journal football poll.
