

Wrestlers top Lincoln, face Indians

The Cleveland wrestling team will face the Generals tonight at 8 here after winning over previously undefeated Lincoln last week.

The Indians, coached by Donald York, own a 2-1 record going into tonight's match.

Last week the Indians dumped Madison, rated first in the PIL in the coaches' pre-season poll, and could pose a formidable threat for the Generals' title bid.

Although having about a .500 season last year, Coach Shewbert expects Cleveland to be "experienced" as the Indians have the entire squad back from last year.

In addition Coach York ex-

pects his grapplers to be stronger in 10 of 13 weight divisions than last year.

Wilson, defending city titlist with Marshall and Grant, will travel here to tangle with the Generals at 4 p.m. this Tuesday. The Trojans should be bolstered by the fact that 8 lettermen have returned from last year.

Coach Shewbert's grapplers played the spoiler's role as the G-men handed Wilson their only defeat in regular season action last year.

Friday the thirteenth proved to be a lucky day for the varsity wrestlers as they toppled pre-

viously unbeaten Lincoln 30-19.

Opening on a good note was freshman Bill Lott, 98 lbs., who pinned his opponent at 1:52 of the second round. The grapplers won the next 5 out of 8 matches to build up an unsurmountable lead.

Chuck Kerns, 136 lbs., found that Friday the thirteenth could mean bad luck as well, as the senior wrestler met his first defeat of the season in losing a 3-2 decision.

Wayne Crawford and Gene Brown were the only other G-men to garner pins against the stubborn Cards.

Generals finish basketball first half by traveling to Wilson, Cleveland

Still with a losing record but steadily improving, the Generals will travel to Cleveland tonight and Wilson Tuesday, to complete the first half.

Rated eighth in pre-season polls, the Indians were in fourth with a 5-3 record after 8 games.

Led by scoring forwards Dave Smith and Dick Jones, the backcourt trio consists of Terry Felton, Bob Hefflinger, and 5-7 Fred Friemark. Tom Delong, Jim Hefflinger and Bob Eshelmon also see action.

The Indians were downed by Wilson, 65-55, in their last outing and will wind up their first half at Jackson Tuesday.

Picked fourth in the pre-season analysis, Wilson was fifth after 8 games with a 4-4 mark.

Only returning players from the city championship squad of last year are Al Mushen and Jack Dale, who long with Scott Park lead the Trojans' scoring punch.

Other starters are Jim Bunzow and 6-5 Jon Huggins who are backed by Mark Mayko, Dave Zinck and Tom Bledsoe.

The Generals were dropped by title favorite Lincoln, 83-75, last Friday, after topping Benson, 55-49, Tuesday. After 8 games their record was 3 wins, 5 losses.

A new General scoring threat has developed in the form of 6'5" Duane Brantley, who showed poise outside and popped inside for 21 points against Lincoln, and had 13 against Marshall.

Ray Brooks joined the starting line-up against Lincoln to score 5 points. Steve Turner and Leo Franz have consistently remained in double figures.
