Wrestling team takes tournament title

Possessing no individual champions, the varsity wrestlers combined sacrifice and dedication with team effort and balanced scoring to win the city wrestling championship, 80-79.

"I've never had a team that has improved so much or shown more dedication," revealed Coach Robert Shewbert after the Generals scored 80 points to win the title.

After finishing second in the dual meets to Marshall, the Generals were not favored, but Coach Shewbert doubled up in weights to allow enough team points for their victory.

Coach Shewbert added that 19 of his 26 wrestlers scored team points, and "you're usually lucky to get 12 or 15 boys to score."

Three boys qualified for the state tournament held today and tomorrow at Gill coliseum in Corvallis. They are Randy Boone at 123 lbs., Chuck Kerns at 130 lbs., and sophomore Dave Gray at 136 lbs.

Boone will not compete due to a shoulder separation, but Wayne Crawford will replace him, as he was third in the city meet.

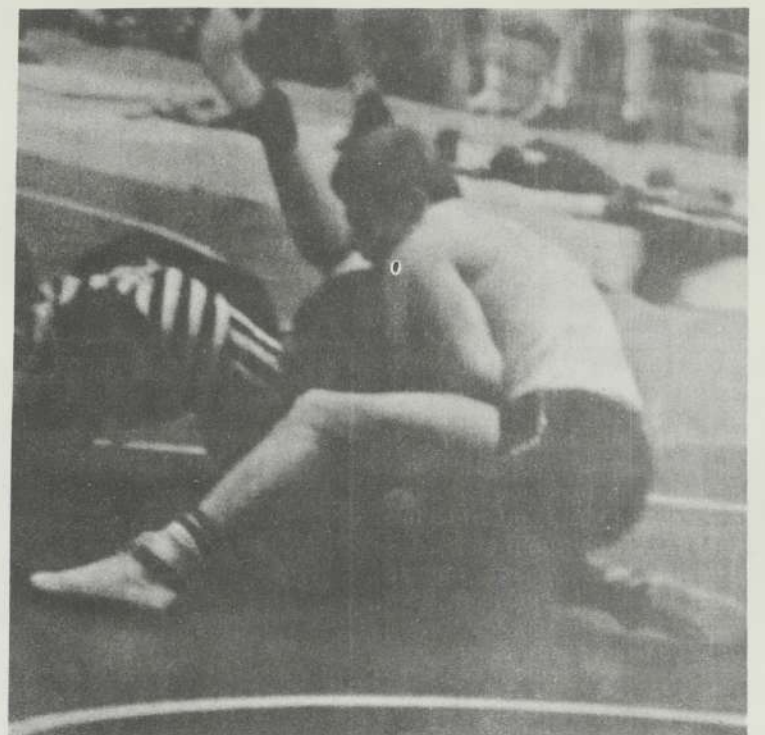
There was only a 12-point spread between first and fourth places, and the 80-point winning total is very low, for Coach Shewbert explained that the winner usually has 100 points.

Defending champion Corvallis is a favorite at the state meet. The best finish by a Portland school was the Generals' fourth place in 1963, when we sent six wrestlers to the meet.

Top competition in the 123-lb. class will come from Corvallis, and at 136 lbs. Larry Owens of Canby is a strong favorite.

"Purky of Milwaukie, and Sessions of Ashland are extremely strong in the 130-lb. class," according to Coach Shewbert.

Besides Corvallis, other top

First-year Coach George Crandall has led defending champion Wilson to an 11 win, 0 loss record including a 7-game winning streak and a victory over the Generals.

Trojan-General games have been crucial for the past 2 years, but Washington, Jefferson and Madison have monopolized league action this year.

One of the league's leading scorers, all-city candidate Jack Dale, powers the Trojan offense, aided by Al Mushan, Scott Park, Jim Bunzow, Jon Huggins and Don Ploghoff.

Leo Franz countered 18 points in last Friday's second loss to Roosevelt. The Generals previously hadn't lost to Roosevelt for 13 years.

Teams around the state are now readying for the 16-team state A-1 tournament at Memorial coliseum March 14-18.

Already qualified for the tournament are top-rated Klamath Falls, Roseburg, Bend, Thurston, Lake Oswego, defending champion North Eugene, and South Salem.
