

Baseball season begins at Madison

After rain washed out the first 6 pre-season games, varsity baseball Coach Roy Harrington is preparing his team for the opening week of league competition beginning Monday.

A final pre-season game is scheduled for today at 4 p.m. at Reynolds high school.

"Next week is very important as far as we are concerned and if we get by those we'll be okay," explained Coach Harrington.

The Generals will open play at Madison Monday against the "always dangerous" Senators. Returning all-star first-baseman Bob Hoffman and third sacker Dave White lead the Senator attack.

"Washington will have perhaps the best pitching staff with Francis Livingston, Tom Shaw and Charles Hunt," revealed Coach Harrington.

Other Senator lettermen in-

clude third baseman Willie Stoudamire, shortstop Charles Stoudamire, second baseman Jackie Smith, catcher Don Holden and outfielder Doug Holden.

Jefferson will pose the first home game threat and the Demos return with Dan Marcela, third baseman; Tom Todd,

shortstop; Dwayne Higginson, second base; and Rick Mickels and Ralph Kingsfather, pitchers.

Franklin, a young team under new coach Walt Buckiewicz, will host the Generals Thursday, and the Jackson Raiders will invade the Generals' field Friday to complete the week's action.

Japanese wrestling team meets with all-stars throughout state

All-star wrestlers throughout Oregon are preparing to grapple the Japanese National wrestling team, lauded by Coach Robert Shewbert as "the finest high school wrestlers in the world."

Touring Oregon are the 8 wrestlers and their coach, Mr. Fumio Hirata, in a series of matches that began March 29 and will end April 6 when the boys leave for San Francisco, Los Angeles, and Hawaii.

Comprised of wrestlers from all of Japan, the boys are undefeated in dual meet action in Oregon. They wrestled here in 1963 and again in 1966.

All of the wrestlers are 17 or 18 years old, and range in weight from 110 to 178 pounds. They are staying in private homes of opposing wrestlers.

Hosted by Chuck Kerns was Masatoshi Saito who he wrestled in Amateur Athletic union action at Portland State Wednesday night. Dave Gray housed Yoshinobu Sato, who left Portland yesterday.

Both the stopwatch and tape measure were present at last Friday's meet against Madison when the Generals toppled the Senators 85-51.

Besides a new city dual meet record the Generals obtained seven "best" Portland Interscholastic league records for a dual meet for the day and 15 changes were made in the top ten list of each event since 1963.

Winning 13 out of 16 events, the Generals lost two events and tied one. Both events lost were to Madison. They were the high hurdles and the pole vault. The tie came in the high jump event.

"Madison was quite tough as predicted, but our squad did a real fine job of meeting the challenge," stated varsity coach Mark Cotton.

Records for the dual meet were made in seven events. Robert Bates won the 100-yard dash with a 10.3 timing, Onia Bates won in the 220, 440 and the long jump, Bruce McCormack in the 880, Greg Kreimeyer in the jave-

lin, and the 440 relay team consisting of Robert Bates, Ron Brown, Phil Dean and Onia Bates. The 440 relay is a new event in the dual meets.

Onia Bates, senior, broke the city dual meet record in the 440 at the meet. The previous record was 49.6 set by Stan Miller from Jefferson. Onia broke the record by one second with 49.5.

Today's meet will be held against Franklin there at 3:45.

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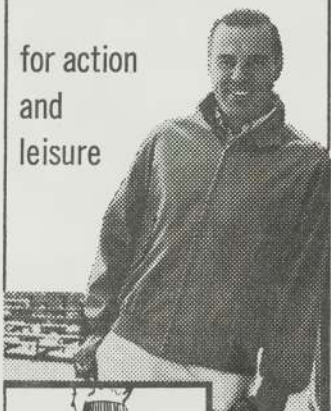
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
