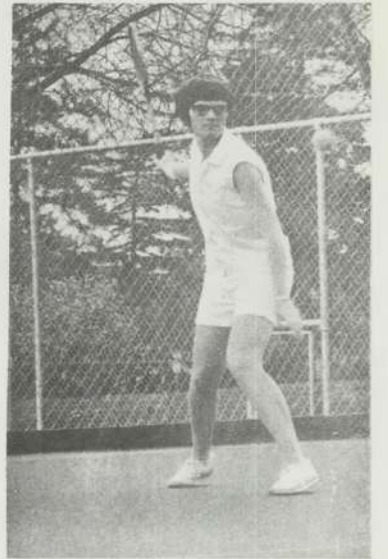
Girls' tennis team wins Wilson match; takes city, heads for state competition

Greg Kreimeyer, state best at 208 feet in the javelin, will join Walt Erickson, 192 feet, in that event. Bob Ewen and Don Philpot are the shotputters.

Ewen and Onia are entered in the long jump, while Sig Jensen and Leo Franz will high jump.

High hurdlers are Ron Brown, fastest in the city in the event, and Bob Blackford. Brown and Jim Gee will skim the low hurdles.

Hansen, Breese, Gilbert, and McCormmach will run the 440 relay, Nick Munroe and George Risdal will pole vault, and Jim Houghton and Ralph Bakkensen will hurl the discus.

The city meet will be next Friday at Madison.
