Both teams qualified 21 men for today's meet in action at Madison last Friday. Madison was the closest other competitor, qualifying 15.

Most of the General hopes lie with sprinter Onia Bates, who qualified in the 100, 220, long jump and anchored the winning 440 relay team.

Setting a new meet record in the javelin at 202 feet, 7 inches, was Greg Kreimeyer, only to have the record broken by John Deer of Roosevelt with a throw of 204 feet.

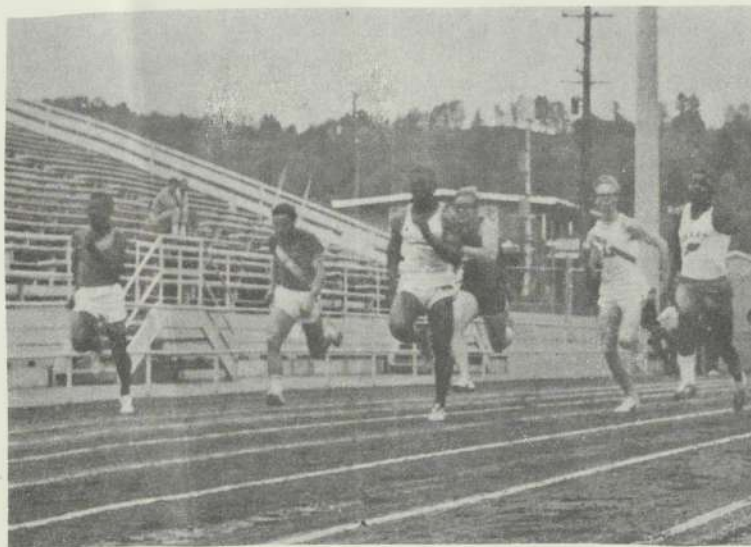
Bob Ewen unloaded a 57 foot, 3 1/2 inch shot put to down Steve Stocker of Marshall who was second at 55 feet, 11 inches.

Kirk Breese ran a career best of 2:00.7 in the 880, to finish fourth in the city.

Hurdler Ron Brown won both his heats and is expected to be a top finisher today.

Chuck Kinsey ran a 9:54.7 two-mile, Bruce McCormach ran a 4:33.8 mile, Nick Munro tied for first in the pole vault, Walt Ericksen was third in the javelin, and Jim Houghton qualified in the discus.

But looking at statistics, hitting and fielding fell off sharply. Four .300 hitters last year, 1 this year, and some players made twice as many errors as they made last year.

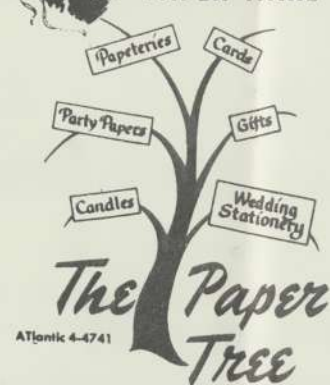
Only one situation looks really good, and that's the outlook for next year. All of the pitchers will return, including Steve Turner, Greg Walsh, and Jamie Eoff.
