

Other activities will be held in between until March 11 and 12, during Spring Vacation.

On March 11, there will be agency workshops at Westminister Presbyterian Church, and on March 12, there will be a tour of facilities at the Jewish Community Center. At the Community Center students will be interviewed by volunteers as to what type of social work they prefer.

Students indicating intent will be asked to work with an individual social worker on a oneto-one basis. Relationship and field experience will exist for two months, or a period to include 3 or 4 meetings.

The program is designed to be held other than school hours and with respect for confidentiality of agency clients. Initial interviews with the students for backgrounds of interest and hobbies, orientation, small discussion groups, working arrangements with an individual social worker on a one-to-one basis, and supervisory agency personnel are available to the students.

A summer work placement will follow for the interested students.
