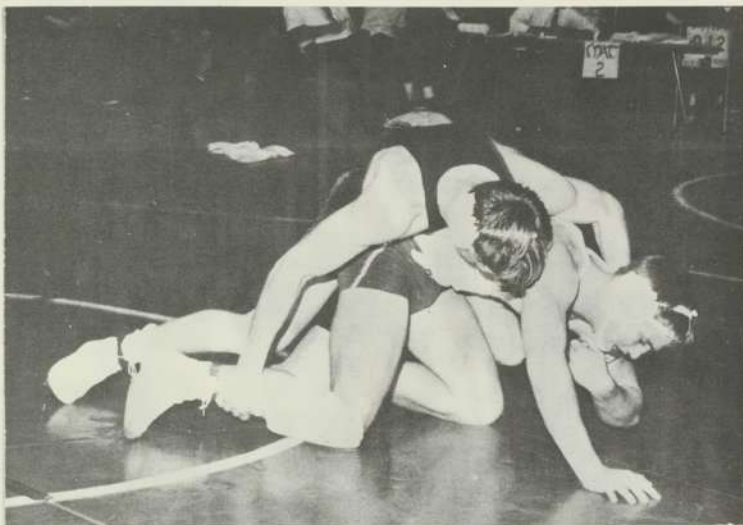


11 lettermen return

Working out since November 15 have been 45 members of the varsity team in preparation for the pre-season schedule and the PIL schedule.

The pre-season schedule consisted of three meets, the Marshall high school meet December 2, the Beaverton meet, and the final meet tomorrow, the Corvallis Invitational tournament against Corvallis, North Eugene, and Milwaukie.

The Marshall High School Invitational tournament had Grant wrestlers meeting opposition from Marshall, David Douglas and Lake Oswego. The Beaverton-Grant meet was the only dual competition of the pre-season meets.
