

Indoor track meet to host high school, college athletes

The annual Portland Invitational track meet will be held on January 27 at 7:30 p.m. at the Memorial Coliseum.

High school track events will be entered only by invited high school students throughout Oregon. Other events will be entered by former Grant track students, college track members and national and world champions.

"Last year a special attraction was Jim Ryun, the world record breaker in the mile," commented Mark Cotton, track coach. "I would certainly like to see him back as a participant this year, as well as the other track stars scheduled to be present."

Ron Brown has been invited to be a participant in the high hurdle event. Bruce McCormach will be running in the mile.

"There is also a two-mile relay event," stated Coach Cotton. "If we are invited to enter this event, Chuck Kinsey, John Adamovics, Scott Jackson, and a fourth runner yet to be named will participate."

Tickets are already on sale for \$2.50, \$3, \$4, and \$5. Students under the age of 15 will be admitted for half price.
