Turner and 6-5 Bill Flowers gave the needed height to the G-men for a slight rebounding advantage.

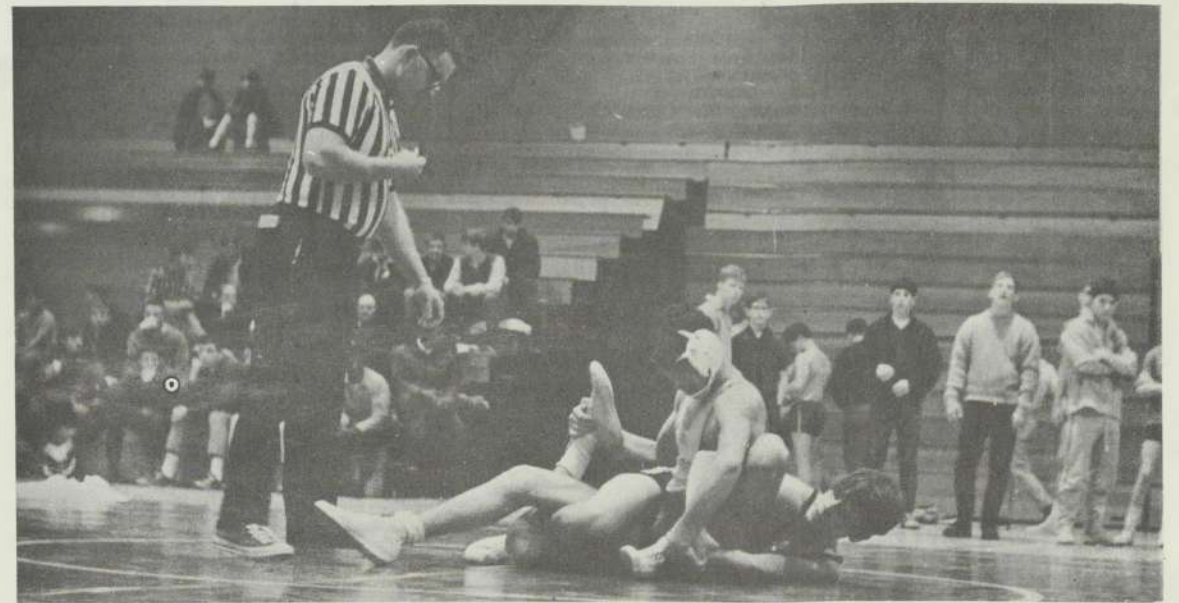

Although they lost to the Madison Senators 20-30 last week, the varsity matmen are looking forward to the district tournament next Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

"Although the squad did a great job we were just overpowered," stated Coach Shew-

bert. The Generals won 4 out of the 13 matches and drew 1. Winning his match by a decision was Dennis Semler, who beat his man 1-0. Pinning his man in 15 seconds of the third round was Dave Gray. Also Wayne Crawford pinned his man in the first round. Team captain Don Sorber won his match by default and Barry Hasson drew with his man 4-4.

Finishing the season yesterday with Washington, the Generals are preparing to meet with all of the Portland schools here at Grant next week. There are several returning state champions, according to Mr. Shewbert, and the competition will be very tough. According to Coach Shewbert, Madison, Marshall and Franklin should give us the most trouble in the tournament.

So, boys beware—the girls can finally fight back!!

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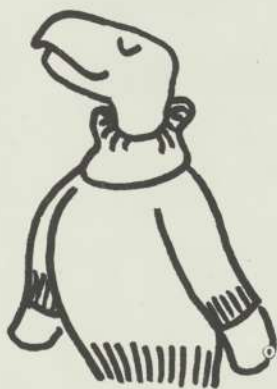
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
