

## Insurance rates for sporty cars said to be higher

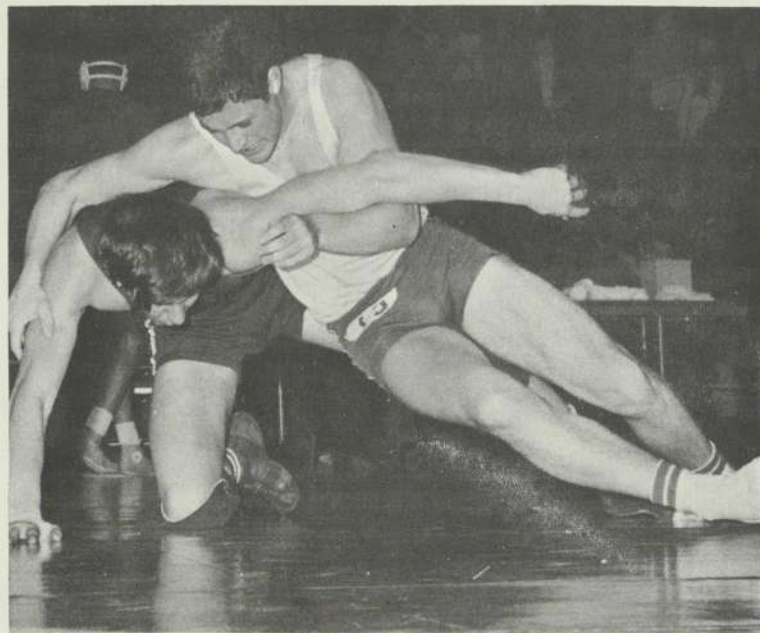
Have you ever wanted to own a sportscar? Or are you driving one right now? Have you thought about the factors which are linked to the insurance rate for a sportscar?

Factors which insurance companies look at when determining the rates are: the person that drives the car, the number of tickets and accidents which he has had, what he uses the car for, the build and the value of the car. They also look at the fact that parts are harder to get for a sportscar especially if it's foreign made.

For example, if you had had a couple of tickets in the last few months and wanted to buy a '67 Corvette Stingray, for collision alone you would pay around \$800. Add \$290 for liability and you would pay close to \$1,100 annually for your insurance. Even if the car were foreign made your insurance would be about the same.

The Oregon Automobile Dealers Association said that in 1966 4,190 miscellaneous and foreign cars were purchased in Oregon. This figure doesn't include Volkswagens.

According to an editorial comment in an insurance newspaper, "Nationwide insurers say that the owners of convertibles and sportscars are a higher risk to them than are owners of hard top models. The adult accident rate is 30 percent higher than the average. In young people the rate is 20 percent above the average."

# Generals take city wrestling tourney

Grant's varsity grapplers came through again for the second straight year to win the city championship in wrestling last weekend. With a total score of 88 points, 8 points ahead of second place Madison, the G-men were always pressed with competition from Madison, Cleveland and Wilson high schools in the final rounds.

Earning first place medals for their fine showing was senior Wayne Crawford who defeated Kim Biggs of Madison 10-6 at 123 lbs., and junior Dave Gray who pinned his opponent from Franklin at 141 lbs. Both Wayne and Dave earned positions in the

State Tournament to be held today and tomorrow at Corvallis.

Coming in second place for the Generals was senior captain

Don Sorber at 191 lbs. and Ivory Nicholas at the 157 lb. bracket. They, too, earned trips to Corvallis for the State Tournament.

Third place positions in city were taken by Bill Lott and Mike Reineker. John Haskins and Gerald Taylor both finished fourth for the season.

In all, the victory was a fine effort by the team in which 20 of the 26 wrestlers scored points for the team compared to 19 on last year's championship team.

After their victory, coach Shubert commented, "I'm really proud of the boys, they did an excellent job."

Frank Bowlby, heavyweight from Wilson High, was named outstanding PIL wrestler for the year by the coaches. Bowlby pinned every opponent he faced during the season, including his championship match against last year's state champ, Wayne Karney of Lincoln.
