The girls are rotated according to their opponents. Only six girls are allowed to play against each school. When playing the tougher teams, the top girls will be used.

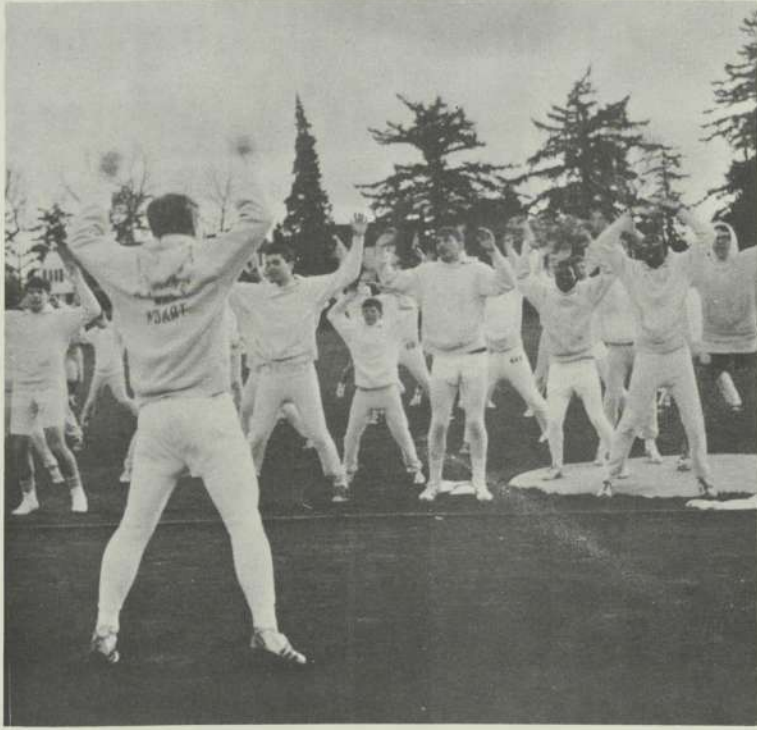
Some of the tougher teams will be Madison, Wilson, Jackson and Lincoln.
