

# Arts classes make furniture



GARY VENABLE puts the finishing touches on the cabinet he has made in woodworking class, as other members of the class work on their projects.

"Many fine pieces of furniture will be on display in center hall," commented industrial arts instructor Louis Schilke about the woodworking display May 13-17.

"We want to show both the parents and students how well the woodworking students have constructed their projects," stated Mr. Schilke.

Cutting boards with original patterns and designs, gun cabinets, coffee tables, end tables, hope chests, night stands, lamps, and various serving bowls are just a few of the many projects students are working on.

Several kinds of hardwood including walnut, maple, birch, oak, myrtle wood, and mahogany are used for the furniture pieces. Many types of veneer and plywoods are being used also.

Senior Cliff Tillery is finishing a dog house for his Daeshund named Peanut. "The house will have green siding and a nameplate over the door," added Cliff.

A six foot high gun cabinet made of pine is senior Mark Putnam's project. "The cabinet will have two small storage spaces, three drawers, and glass windows in the doors. I plan to finish the cabinet with a walnut stain," concluded Mark.

Matching salad and serving bowls are being made by Dave LeFeper. "Laminated pieces of wood are skewed out, sanded, and finished on the lathe. I think I'll use a Danish oil finish on them," Dabe added.

"I hope each and every student will be especially careful around the display and not damage any pieces of furniture," mentioned Mr. Schilke. "The kids have really worked hard on all their projects. Our safety record is 100 per cent with no injuries."

# New program, buildings offered at Portland Community College

Voters in a five-county area including Portland and all or parts of counties adjacent to Portland, will go to the polls on Thursday, June 6, to cast ballots on whether to form an area district community college with the present Portland Community college as a nucleus.

The areas that would make up the new district include all of Washington county, the school districts of Lake Oswego, Riverdale, Newberg, Scappoose, Vernonia, St. Helens, Sauvie Island, and Portland.

A number of reasons favor the formation of the new district. Among them are the following: It would avoid duplication of facilities, equipment, programs, administration, planning, and development; provide more efficient and economical operation; reduce cost to students; provide a greater variety of vocational, technical, and adult education, and college transfer programs.

Other advantages include providing a board concerned only with operating a college in its district and teaching more of the skills leading to employment for those students (approximately 60%) not going on to a four-year college.

Directors for the new college district would be elected from seven zones made up of the following high school and elementary school districts: Zone 1—Tigard, Jackson, Wilson, Riverdale, Lake Oswego; Zone 2—Jefferson, Roosevelt, Sauvie Island, Scappoose; Zone 3—Madison and Marshall; and Zone 4—Grant and Washington.

Zone 5—Cleveland and Franklin; Zone 6—Beaverton, Sunset, and Lincoln; Zone 7—St. Helens, Vernonia, Banks, Forest Grove,

Gaston, Hillsboro, Sherwood, and Newberg. Population in each of the zones runs from 85,000 to 95,000 persons.


The present Portland Community college is located on a new campus on Mt. Sylvania and in Failing and Shattuck halls in downtown Portland. These facilities would be used for the new district. As need is exhibited, branch operations in various parts of the district would be implemented.
