

Trackmen win, set records

In the final round of Portland Interscholastic League track meets, two state and one PIL dual meet records were set.

Ron Brown and Bruce McCormmach came through for the Generals, with a state best in the low hurdles and a PIL dual best in the mile. Steve Krohn of Madison added a state best in the 220.

Brown dashed through the low hurdles in a time of 19.9, bettering his old record by one-tenth of a second. Krohn also bettered the 220 time by one-

tenth of a second. McCormmach finished the mile in 4:16.6. The old record that held up for one week was 4:17.5.

Other wins that helped the G-Men down Marshall 100½-35½ and keep them undefeated were the team of Bob Bates, Jeff Swan, Ron Brown and Jim Gilbert in the 440 relay.

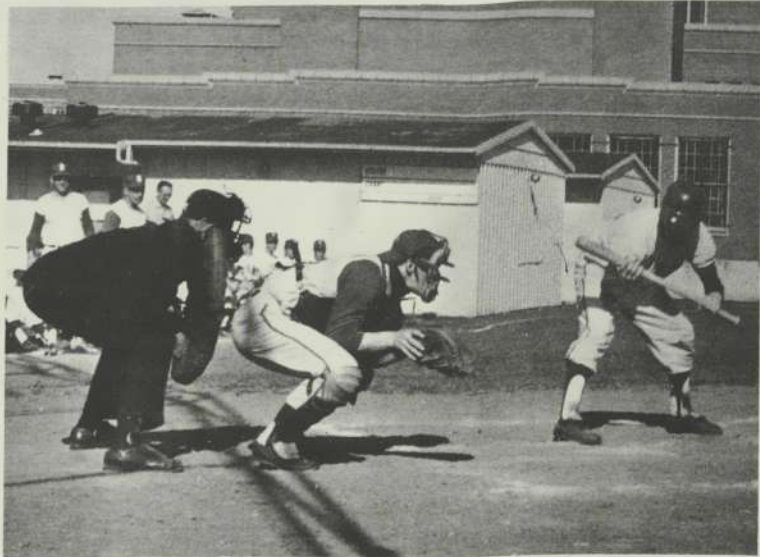

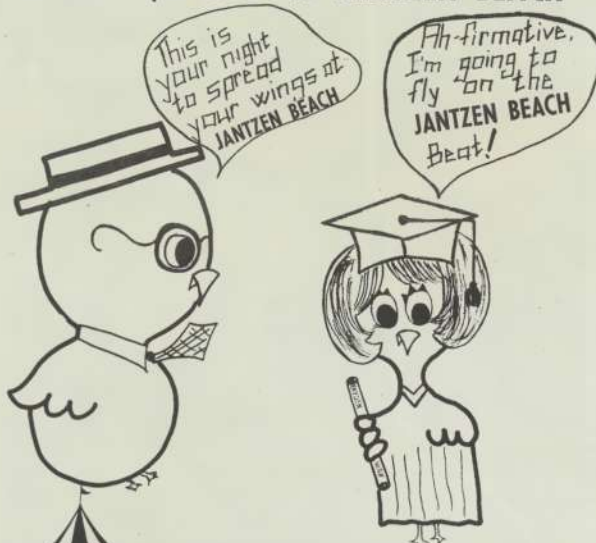
