Girls' tennis team sends 4 to state

In the District One tennis tournament the girls' tennis team, city champions, placed four of nine girls for state competition. The boys' team came in second in the Portland Interscholastic league play.

The girls heading for state competition are Carolyn Lumber, who is ranked number two in the city, Kim Seiverson, and the doubles team of Sherrie Horning and Myrna West.

Carolyn Lumber defeated the number one seeded girl in the city, Mary Crokshank of Wilson, by scores of 6-0 and 6-3 to win the championship. Kim Seiverson defeated Laurie King, also of Wilson, 6-2 and 6-0 for third place in the district. Sherrie Horning and Myrna West defeated teammates Ann Bellerby and Alice Bailey for third place in the doubles competition.

The state tournament will be held today and tomorrow at the Oregon State college campus in Corvallis.

When asked if she thought the girls had a good chance at state Mrs. Virginia Behm, girls' tennis coach commented, "If we play well, we'll have a good chance to place in state."

The boys' team didn't seem to do as well in the city play-offs as did the girls. Teams from Wilson, Madison and Franklin took care of most of the state berths.
