

G-Men hand Marshall defeat

If you believe that a football coach can take his team into a locker room with only a 6-0 lead at halftime, talk to them in a direct but forceful manner, and an hour later walk away with a 30-0 win, then you're right.

SUCH WAS the score and direct manner in which Coach Wolf and his Generals handed Marshall their first defeat last Saturday at Marshall high school.

Grant scored only once in the

first half on a 50 yard sprint by Robert Bates with less than a minute to go before halftime. Preceding this was an interception by Steve Hopkins on the 50

IN THE first half Grant netted 46 yards on the ground with no net yards in the air.

Then came the halftime buzzer and from then on the Generals took charge and scored four touchdowns, two in each quarter.

The second touchdown of the game came on a 11 yard run by halfback Robin Sinclair. Two minutes later Marshall fumbled on their own 36 yard line. The next play Sinclair ran it into the end zone for another touchdown.

IN THE fourth quarter halfback Danny Mayo scored two touchdowns on runs of three and four yards.

For the second half Grant netted 128 yards rushing and another 38 yards passing.

ACCORDING TO Coach Wolf, the defense played a great game. Interceptions occurred throughout the game. Grant stole four of Marshall's passes. Two of them setting up touchdown drives. Marshall never really got close to scoring a touchdown. In fact, the only time they entered Grant territory was on a penalty.

Tonight's game is figured to be a tough one, according to Coach Wolf. "Franklin is rated number one in the Red Division and should be real tough to beat," said Coach Wolf.

Last year the Generals downed the Quakers 33-6, but this year they are rated much higher and are figured one of the better teams in the city.
