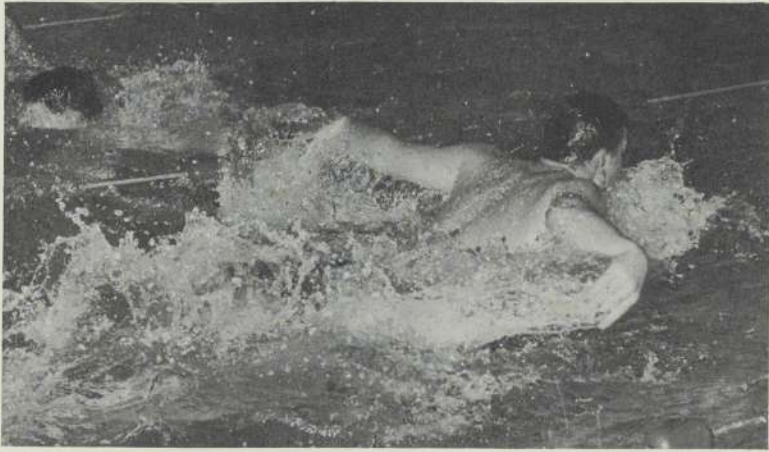


Team competition rough

Swimmers sink opponents



A VERY DIFFICULT stroke appears easy as Rich Mills does the butterfly. 81-15 was the score as the Generals barely missed a perfect score in the meet against Washington.

"There is more competition between members than other teams," stated swim coach Carl Rubin when asked about his team. "So far we have had no competition but we expect more as we go against stronger teams," he added.

The Generals' first meet was held against Roosevelt which ended with the G-Men capturing first place in every event and rolling up a score of 75-14.

The following day the team moved to Buckman where they took on Washington. This meet took on the same aspects of the Roosevelt meet with the Generals again capturing first place in every event. The only difference was the score which the G-Men pushed to within five points of a perfect score of 86. This left the Colonials the unlucky score of 13.

Mr. Rubin stated that he was very pleased with Bill Prowse in the 100 yard freestyle event, Rich Mills in the Butterfly, Daryl Pape in the Backstroke, and with the 320 yard freestyle relay team which consisted of Rich Mills, Bill Prowse, Jeff Pittman and Mark Powell. He added that the overall team effort was wonderful and when they are in better condition they will really move.

"Intersquad competition is really rough and nobody can be certain of their first place standing for more than one meet; this is why we have such a strong team," stated Mr. Rubin.

G-Men foil Franklin 6-0; tag Lincoln next victim

When talking to Coach Wolf after his Generals handed Franklin a 6-0 defeat last Friday, he said, "I'm very pleased about the way the team has come along. Their success depends on how quickly they adjust to playing varsity ball." This year's team has not only lived up to his comments, but has gone undefeated in pre-season games so far this year.

Picked to be a preview of the city championship this year, the Grant-Franklin game ended up as the polls predicted with Grant the victor.

Grant rolled up 212 total yards in their win, 198 in rushing and 14 yards passing. 103 of these yards were contributed to the brilliant running of Robert Bates, one of which was a five yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter. Robin Sinclair carried the ball 15 times for a total of 74 yards rushing. He also fired the game's only completed pass for an additional 14 yards.

Grant's only touchdown

came on a 92 yard drive which started at the Grant 8 yard line. Sinclair and Bates combined their running skills and Bates ended, getting the touchdown.

According to Coach Wolf, the defense played a key roll in the last two Grant games. Not letting the other teams score has been an asset to their victories. Very few teams in the state can support this fine defensive record, and it is one to be proud of.

Tonight's action begins at 8:00 at Lincoln high school, when the Generals open the regular season against the Lincoln Cardinals.

Picked to finish last in the Green Division, the Lincoln team is not one to be taken lightly. They are fresh from a 19-6 victory over Washington. The Generals' feelings towards this game can be summed up in the words of Coach Wolf. "We can expect a good game Friday. We can't overlook Lincoln, because if we start overlooking them, then that's when we get beat. We play one game at a time, and the next one's with Lincoln."
