

G-Men trip Lincoln

Generals smash to 24-6 win

Lincoln's speed merchant John Mays gave the Generals a scare by returning the opening kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown, but that was all they were able to score as the Grant Generals defeated the Lincoln Cardinals 24-6 last Friday at Lincoln high school.

Mays, who runs the 100 in 10 seconds, ruined an unscored upon Grant defense

since their opening game with Marshall.

The first touchdown for the Generals came in the first quarter on a 32-yard run by Robin Sinclair. Robert Bates then scored from 5 yards and his first touchdown of the day, which gave the Generals a 13-6 first quarter lead.

Bates scored again in the second quarter on a 1-yarder and that proved to be the

scoring punch that Grant needed. The halftime score ended up 20-6, Grant's favor.

The second half of action proved to be an even battle as Grant scored only 4 points. These came on safeties.

Sinclair ended up with a total of 170 yards rushing in 12 carries and Bates with 98 yards in 12 carries. Total net yardage for Grant was 334 yards.

Tomorrow night's action begins at 8:00 at Civic Stadium with the Jefferson Democrats. Jefferson is picked a close third in the Green Division.

This year's Demos are considered to be one of the tougher teams in the state, according to Coach Wolf. They are thought to be a very explosive football team, and an example of this is their last 39-16 win over Benson in which they scored 32 points in the last quarter, and gained 353 yards rushing.

Jefferson has a balanced running and passing game with Ralph Nickerson calling signals and doing the throwing, while speedy Gregg Woods has been coming through with long runs and pass receiving.

Nevertheless, the Generals are out to remain undefeated and a good game is to be expected tomorrow night at Civic Stadium.

Scott Jackson running the course in 12:12.8 became the new record holder of Grant's cross country circuit as he clipped nine tenths of a second off the old record set in 1964 by former General, Ron Byers. Jackson's closest competitor was John Adamovics who was timed in 12:51.8.

The Generals captured the first seven places on the way to their win. Greg Schukart claimed third, Steve Gerrard fourth, Mike Naylor fifth, Don Johnson sixth, and Jeff Klein seventh.

The G-Men face Madison and Roosevelt next week. According to Coach Mark Cotton, they will be our toughest competitors as they are also undefeated at this time.

On the JV level the Sergeants ran away with another victory by defeating Washington and Cleveland. Tim Myers captured first place with a time of 9:28.9. Craig Bresse then romped in second while John Mears, Doug Ovens, and Scott Evensen came in third, fourth and fifth respectively.
