Dave plays for an average of two to five weddings a week for which he receives \$10.00. His payment for a church service is \$7.50.

Dave also plays for a service at Holy Rosary Catholic Church in addition to playing at All Saints. He plays for weddings all over the city.

Dave studies organ under Balerian Fox, who states, "Dave is a very good musical talent. I would recommend him right now for any accompanying job in the city."
