

Harriers capture city crown, look ahead to state competition

By capturing seven out of the first 18 places, the varsity harriers captured the 1968 cross country title with a total of 42 points. In picking up the victory the Generals claimed the right to go to the state meet next week.

SCOTT JACKSON toured the course in 13:13 to become the city champion on the varsity level. Scott's closest competition came from Dave Wienecke of Lincoln who finished the 2.5-mile course seven seconds slower, timing 13:20.

Pre-race favorite Mike Hann of Benson finished third with a time of 13:24, which was 11 seconds off the pace.

The Generals claimed first, seventh, ninth, eleventh, fourteenth, sixteenth, and eighteenth in competition on the varsity level.

JOHN ADAMOVIKS claimed seventh, stopping the clock at 13:47, while Greg Schukart rambled in ninth in 13:57. Next to finish for the G-Men was Steve Gerrard who finished in 14:09. Then came Mike Naylor and Jeff Klein with times of 14:13 and 14:18.

By capturing the meet the Mark Cotton coached harriers remained undefeated for the second year in a row. Madison, a top contender for the trophy, finished a distant second with 70 points while Jackson and Benson finished third and fourth with 125 and 127.

THE TOP four teams will compete for the state title tomorrow at Willamette University. The race starts at 10:30 a.m. and, according to Mr. Cotton, it should be a good race. Some of the tougher teams competing in this year's meet will be Corvallis who has won the state title for the past three years. The Dalles and Lake Oswego will also be top contenders for the trophy this year.

The overall favorite in this year's meet will be Steve Pretonian of Marshfield. Steve won the meet last year with a time that was 40 seconds faster than his closest competitor.

"We will be a top contender," stated Mr. Cotton. "Scott Jackson should be able to finish in the top ten," he added.

On the junior varsity level the Sergeants captured their city meet by claiming seven out of the first ten places. Tim Myers captured the meet with a time of 10:10.8 while John Othus claimed third in 10:36.0.

Generals roll over Benson

Scoring five times in four quarters gave the varsity football team a 31-20 win over Benson last Friday and the right to play the red division leader, Franklin, next week in a duel that will end with one team going to state.

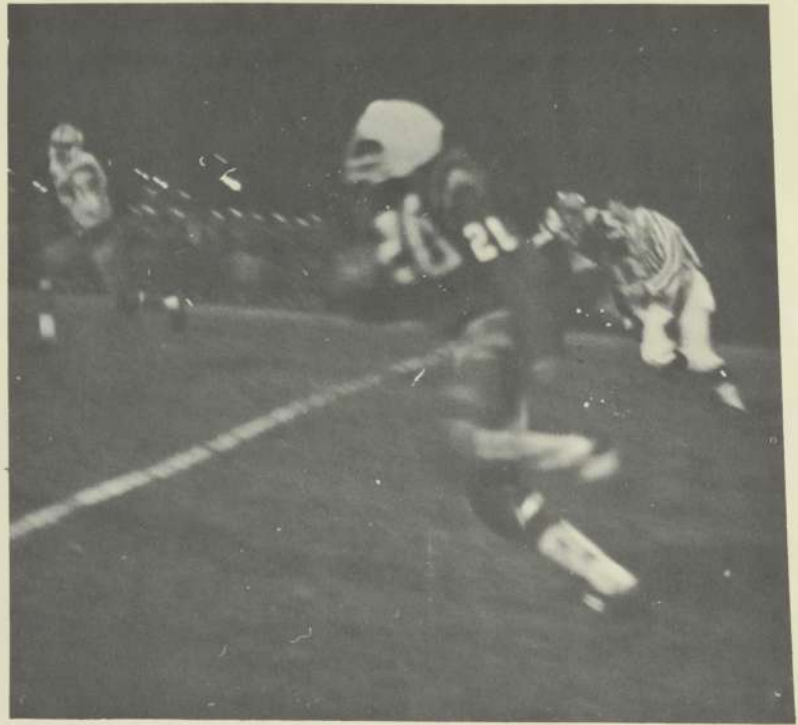
Dan Percich flipped an 11-yard pass to Dave Edwards who slipped into the endzone to start the scoring for the G-Men. Gary Horton kicked the first PAT.

Minutes later the Generals were at the fifty yard line when Bobby Bates broke through the Benson line and streaked the full distance to the goal to add another TD to the Generals' score.

The second period faired not so well for the G-Men as Benson's Mike Meyer tossed a 36 yard pass to Greg Henderson who picked up six points for the Engineers. A few plays later Meyer took the ball at the nine yard line and ran into the endzone. Both kicks were good and for the first time this season the Generals were behind as the G-Men's second kick failed.

With nine seconds left in the half June Jones hit Bobby Bates with a 27 yard pass which Bates then ran into the endzone. The kick was blocked but the Generals had a 19-14 lead at half time.

In the third quarter Bill Hjelm cut across the Benson defense at the two yard line and into the endzone to boost the score to 25-14.
