Last Saturday the wrestling team traveled to Corvallis in hopes of gaining a victory at the Corvallis Invitational Tournament, but the outcome didn't equal their goal as the Generals finished in third place in the four-team tournament.

A strong North Bend team won the tournament, which was decided on the team which had the least number of black marks against them. Corvallis came in second place, Grant came in third, and Canby finished in last place.

The tournament was divided into two main categories labeled "A" and "B." The "A" bracket consisted of the first team varsity wrestlers and the "B" team of the second. Wrestlers on both teams wrestled three matches during the tournament, facing one opponent from each school.

This year's captain of the team, Dave Gray, was the only "A" champion the team had. Dave won all three matches, including two by pins. He won the 141-pound division.

"The 'B' team wrestled a total of 39 matches and won 30 of them," said "B" team Coach Bill White. He added that two of the nine matches they lost were by forfeits, so they only lost a total of seven matches. The "B" team came in first place and the champions from Grant were Mere Johnson, Frank Quintano, Dale Casey, Dan Baisley, Bill Lott, and Bob Lott.

Tonight the team travels to McNary High School at Salem. McNary is considered to be one of the top teams in their league. The meet is scheduled to start at 7 p.m. and should prove to be quite a duel.

Jones and Steve Hopkins.

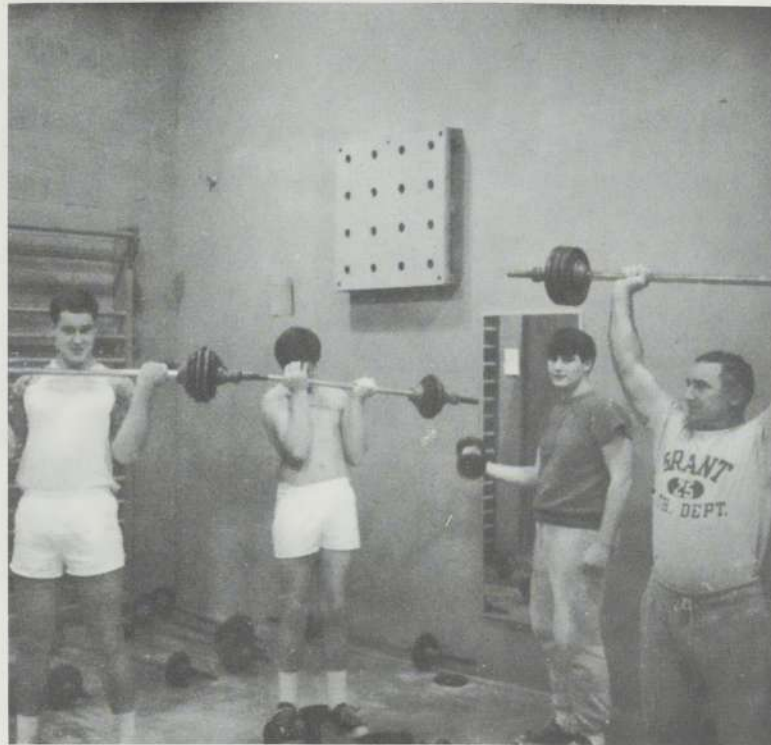

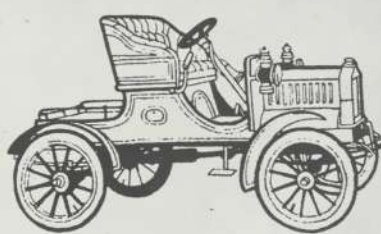

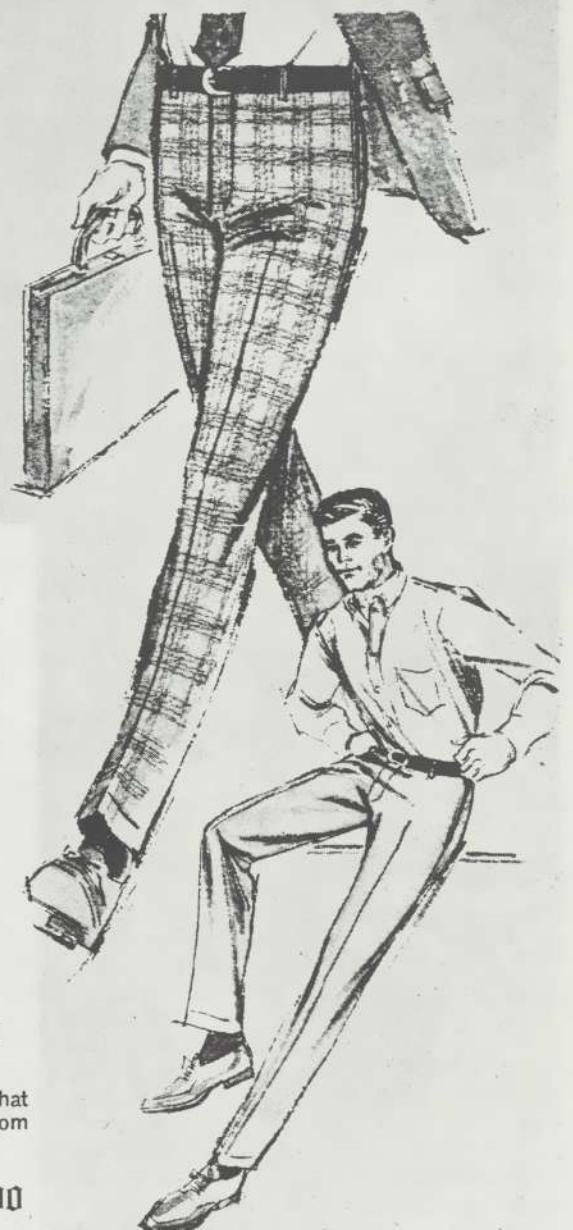
