Juniors! Would you like to be a host brother or sister to an American Field Service student from another country? Would you like to share a few months of your life with another boy or girl in exchange for a close and wonderful friendship that could last forever?

IF YOU ARE interested in bringing a foreign student into your home to share a life with your family, pick up an application from Miss Mildred Eikland in room 35.

The purpose of the AFS exchange program is to enable students to gain an understanding of the United States, its people, educational system, customs and ideals through a meaningful involvement in a U.S. family, school, and community.

This program also enables the visiting student to bring a better understanding of his own country to his American school, family and friends while he is here.

HAVING BEEN conducted for over 20 years, AFS has allowed about 47,000 students to partici-

pate in its programs, and brings an average of 3,000 foreign students from over 60 countries to the U.S. each year as well as sending approximately 1,400 American students abroad.

Houses for next year's foreign exchange students will be selected in the spring.
