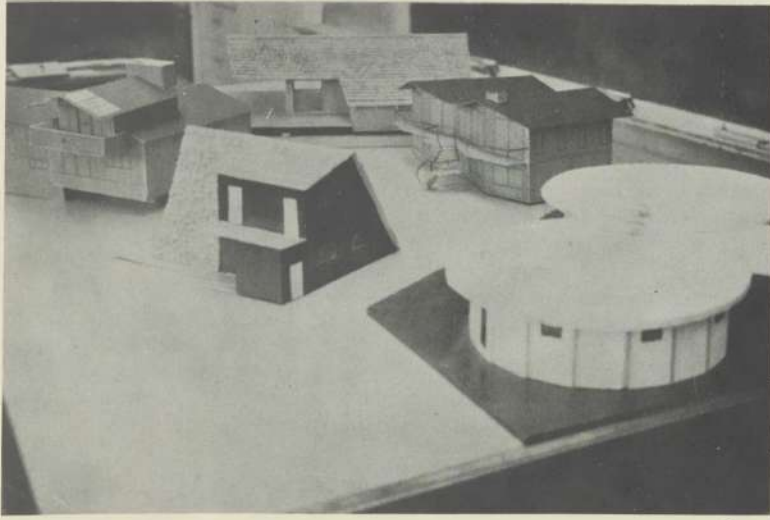


Blueprints drawn up for model houses
