Another time when the cagers were down by ten to Madison the crowd began to yell and the Generals overcame the deficit to win the game by five points.

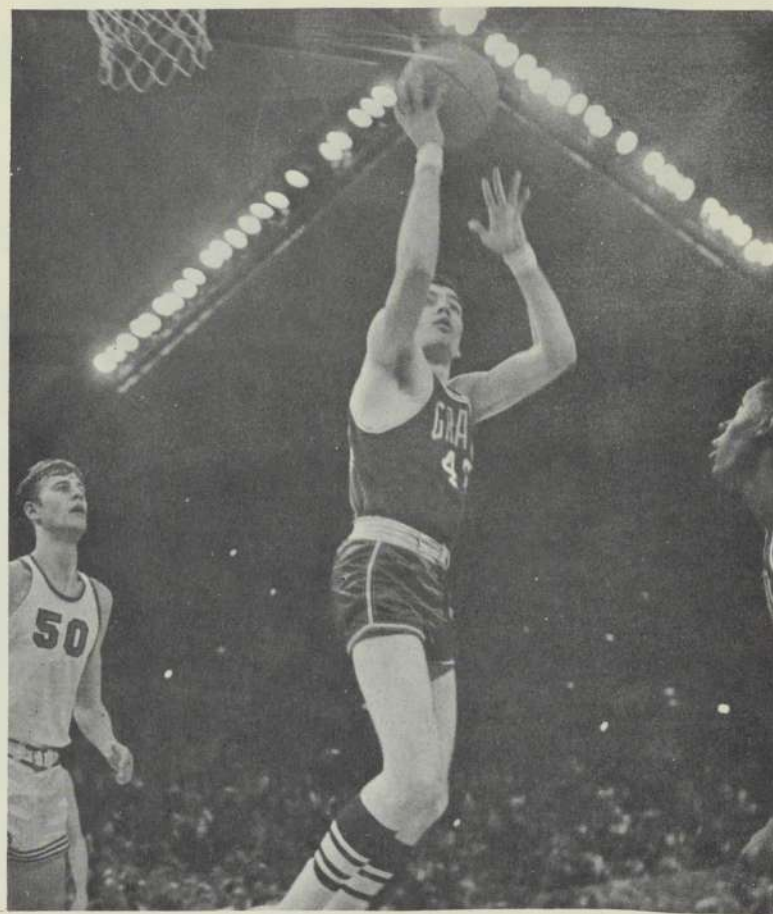
