Portland State to incorporate 'guaranteed enrollment' plan

A new policy of "guaranteed enrollment" is being inaugurated for the 1969 Portland Summer Term classes held at Portland State University, according to Leroy V. Pierson, director.

This year, Pierson said, anyone wanting to enroll in any of the more than 700 courses in the eight or eleven week sessions, providing he or she has the necessary academic requirements, will be admitted even if a new section has to be opened.

Previously, would-be students who made their plans for summer school sometimes had them upset by a closure of a course during registration day. This could be particularly disappointing when special courses of

study in degree requirements were at stake.

Pierson also explained that the only exceptions to the new policy will be courses listed in the catalog or time schedules with the warning "enrollment limited" or the designation "special program."

More than 50 special programs and workshops, covering such varied subjects as aerospace, conservation, percussion, smoking and health, camping and outdoor recreation will be offered, in addition to the 700 regular courses.

Registration for the summer term is on June 23. The eight week term is from June 24 until August 16, with the eleven week term extending to September 6.

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
