

Annual gym show presents varied athletic program

"We expect the biggest challenge to be Madison on May 8," said Coach Mrs. Diane Cedros.

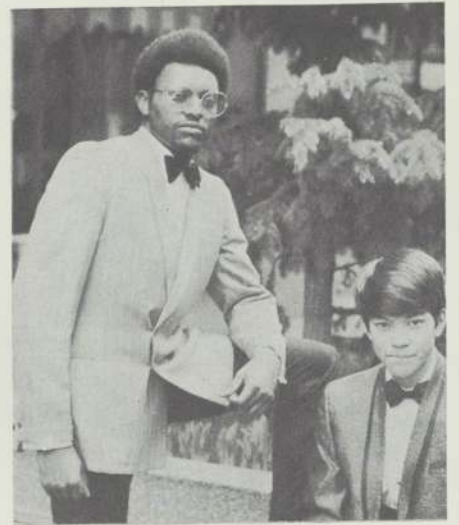
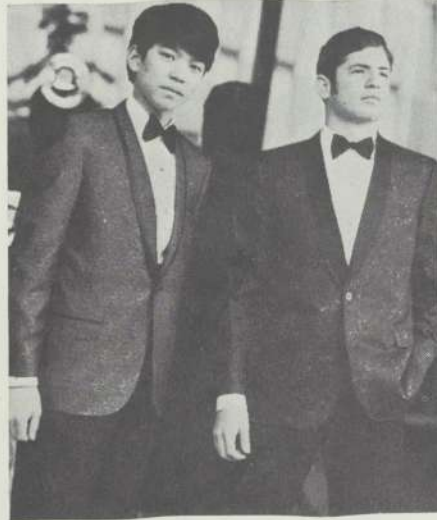
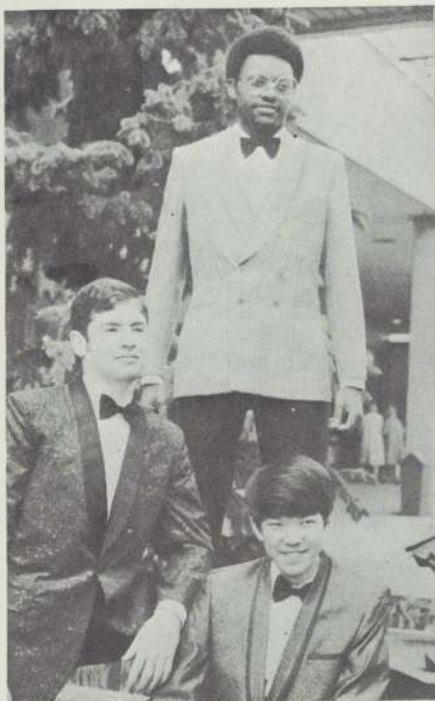
Patty Jensen had an eagle on the 9th hole of the front nine at Rose City against Lincoln.
