

Gendrills capture state title

For the second year in a row, the Gendrills took the first place trophy home from the annual State Dance Team Competition, which was sponsored by the Corvallis High School Sparta-Pacers. Gendrills also won two other trophies; one for costumes and one for the best overall team of every team competing.

With 28 girls performing, the Gendrills were one of the largest of the 29 teams performing in the meet held at Corvallis High School. The categories were divided into large teams with 13 and above performers and small

teams with 12 and under. Two numbers from "Sweet Charity" were done by the Gendrills in the preliminaries: "Big Spender" and "Big Brass Band." For these the girls wore new blue dance outfits. In the evening performance during the finals, top hats and stockings were worn as part of the costumes as the girls danced to "Broadway." These two outfits were the ones which merited the Costumes Trophy.

Winning the second place trophy in the large division were the Sparta-Pacers from Corval-

lis. In the small division, the Buckerettes from Pendleton won first and the Wolverettes from Mill City placed second.

Tonight and tomorrow night the Gendrills will be performing at the Benson Tech Show in the Benson auditorium. There will be two performances and 12 girls will dance each night, to the number "San Jose."
